Dalit Wilhelm RN, PhDc, president of Omega Lambda chapter, is happy to share the latest data: as for today, we are 69 active members, 35 members from universities and nursing schools, 9 different institutions out of 23 in Israel,

34 nurse leaders from 10 different health organization, hospitals and community centers. Year 2020: 90 members, 70% renewal 30% new members – that was a new concept for many of the members, year 2021: 82 members 70 % renewal 30 % new members, year 2022: 70 members 86% renewal, 14 % new members. We will continue to work for growth and development of our chapter in Israel

Abby Kra-Friedman RN, PhD, successfully defended her doctoral study entitled "Determinants of reproductive freedom among Israeli women ages 18-50: A mixed methods study". She graduated with honors from Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, PA, USA, in the accelerated 3-year Phd program with a concentration in transcultural nursing. Dr. Kra-Friedman currently serves as the head of undergraduate women's health at the Henrietta Szold School of Nursing at the Faculty of Medicine at Hebrew University and Hadassah Ein Keren in Jerusalem, Israel. She also serves on the global health policy subcommittee at the International Council of Nurses Nurse Practitioner/Advanced Practice Nursing Network, volunteers at the Israel Midwives Association, and helps immigrant nurses get Israeli licenses and join the nursing workforce



Prof. Efrat Shadmi, in a meeting with Masar students from **Rothschild Partnerships** program talked about the leading roles of nurses and the curriculum in the nursing department at the University of Haifa, which is the leader in international rankings among all nursing departments in Israel. Particularly gratifying was the fascinating discussion that developed on the issue of the shortage of nurses, compared to the lack of standards, the difference between "gender" roles for women and men, and the paths of professional development, including a Master's degree with clinical expertise









Flora Haim RN, MA, is a member of the Executive Development Program at Klalit Community Health Services, a member of the Bio-design program in Israel on behalf of the Technion and Microsoft. Flora is establishing a start-up to prevent re-hospitalizations for patients with heart failure. Flora, a senior nurse in the Continuing Care Unit is bringing to the fore the needs and the journey of repeated hospitalizations of the patient with heart failure in the community, in hospitals and in the Continuing Care Unit or inpatient institutions. Flora graduated the Management Leadership Course in Health Systems and serves as an Innovation Project



Her motivation stemmed from the fact that since nurses are the largest sector and producers of information in the medical file nurses make the most extensive use of diverse technologies on a daily basis (from blood pressure to Operating room). Given that, Reham wanted to learn innovation and translation of our wide knowledge into technological solutions for unmet needs of the patients. Reham recommends to anyone who is interested in technologies and innovation, to take part in such a course in order to leverage the practice of nursing globally

Kochav Bennaroch RN, PhD, a researcher of insomnia and mood among hospital nurses, is happy to announce the opening of the 3rd national course of Cognitive Behavioral Therapy for Insomnia (CBTI) in Israel. CBTI is the first choice, evidence based therapy for Insomnia- the most common sleeping problem worldwide and especially among nurses. Kochav, who serves as the coordinator of the course and a member of the steering committee for its establishment, is the first Israeli nurse who graduated the advanced training for insomnia therapy and the Fellowship Program in Sleep Medicine at Penn University. Since then, she promotes sleep health education and teaching in the field of insomnia and CBTI among Israeli clinicians: nurses, doctors, psychologists etc. She is a member of the Israeli and European Societies for Sleep Research and participates in the European Working Group for Insomnia and CBTI. Dr. Bennaroch would be happy to promote nurses' sleep health throughout

Margret Lepp (RN, RNT, PhD) is Professor Emerita at the Institute of Health and Care Sciences, Sahlgrenska Academy, University of Gothenburg, Gothenburg, Sweden. She is Professor at Østfold University College, Halden, Norway and at Inland Norway University of Applied Sciences, Elverum, Norway. She is Adjunct Professor at the School of Nursing and Midwifery, Griffith University, Australia, and at the Faculty of Medicine, Public Health and Nursing, Universitas Gadjah Mada, Yogyakarta, Indonesia. She has an international reputation in drama in education and applied theatre in professional health care education. Her main research areas are within care pedagogics, learning and drama, health care professionals' competence development, internationalization, and conflict management. > Moving forward: Plans are progressing well for the 7th **European Regional** Conference being hosted by Phi Mu Chapter in Bournemouth, England on the 26th-28th of June 2024. We remain a small but active chapter looking forward to recruiting new members. The retention of members remains good.

Recruitment: The chapter continued to recruit members and inducted new members from Slovenia, Rwanda, Ghana, Croatia, India and the Czech Republic. The chapter also had some members volunteering to serve in various leadership positions.

Membership fees: the chapter provided discounted membership fees to enable nurses from lower-income countries to join the chapter. As part of celebrating the 100th anniversary of Sigma, we offered six discounted membership fees to undergraduate and postgraduate nursing students at Swansea university and to date, have received a couple of applications.

Presentations: the chapter provided a presentation as part of the centenary celebrations to nursing students at Swansea university to raise awareness of Sigma and the benefits of membership and promote the six nursing scholarships. We also attended the 8th PhD conference in Zagreb (Croatia) organized by the Alpha Alpha Gamma chapter of the Sigma & Sigma European Region.

Scholarly events: The chapter has sustained a programme of scholarly events over the year and has participated in the Sigma International Research Congress in Edinburgh in July 2022, where a member provided a presentation on some of the research being conducted by Chapter members. In May, we combined our induction ceremony with celebrating International Nurse's Day and Professor Angie Kydd provided a presentation on the Horizon 2020 EuroAgeism project.
