Tau Tau Endowment Fund

Greetings from your Finance Committee!

There has been continued interest in Tau Tau's endowment fund and how it functions. As such, I will try to explain the basics of an endowment and how we both plan to fund our endowment and what we hope to provide with it.

In general, endowment funds are set up with long-term goals to provide a steady and renewable source of money to an individual, group, or cause. Funds can grow in a number of ways both slow and fast. But in almost all cases, academic endowment funds are established to give away grant money on a perpetual basis at a rate of 5% annually. This means that once an endowment fund begins giving away money, it will do so indefinitely, unless dissolved (all money intentionally removed). At a 5% rate, an endowment can provide \$500 in grant money for every \$10,000 invested.

In the case of Tau Tau's endowment, there is a current balance of approximately \$20,000. This means that our local chapter could offer \$1000 in grants and scholarships every year. While this money could be used to supplement our current

mission, the overall vision of the Tau Tau board is to hold onto this money and allow the fund to grow to at least \$50,000 to provide significant financial impact for academic pursuits. Future growth of the endowment will depend on funding from multiple sources and will shift over time as the fund grows. By holding off on releasing funds in the form of grants, the endowment will also receive growth in the form of interest income. Eventually, the interest income will become the major driving force for growth. This idea is key in why the endowment fund is being allowed to grow now.

Once the fund reaches an agreed upon balance; distribution will begin. This distribution will take the form of grants and scholarships that will be provided in-line with the mission statement of STTI and Tau Tau. This will include scholarships for tuition and books, grants for research, and money for nursing mission and charity works.

This explanation hopefully provides greater understanding for the situation with this fund and its purpose for Tau Tau. Thank you for your continuing support in these efforts!


