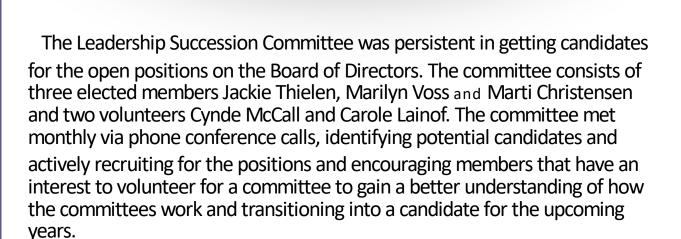
A "word" from your Governance and Co-Counselors!

Sigma Theta Tau International Volunteer Week was April 16-20, 2018. We asked Tau Tau members to share how they volunteer their time.

Several members responded and here is how they spend their "free" time!

Colleen Steinhauser is active with the Boy Scouts of America (BSA). She serves as Troop 99 leader and is the weekend BSA Camporee Health Officer five times a year. Rhubarb Crisp

Ingredients

3/4 cup sugar

3 tablespoons cornstarch

3 cups sliced fresh rhubarb or frozen rhubarb, thawed

2 cups sliced peeled apples or sliced strawberries

1 cup quick-cooking or old-fashioned oats

1/2 cup packed brown sugar

1/2 cup butter, melted

1/3 cup all-purpose flour

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon Vanilla ice cream, optional





Directions

- 1. In a lge. bowl, combine sugar & cornstarch. Add rhubarb & apples or strawberries; toss to coat. Spoon into an 8-in. sq. baking dish.
- 2. In a small bowl, combine the oats, brown sugar, butter, flour & cinnamon until the mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Sprinkle over fruit. Bake at 350° for 45 minutes or until bubbly and fruit is tender. Serve warm with ice cream if desired. **Yield: 8 servings**.

Editor's Note: If using frozen rhubarb, measure rhubarb while still frozen, then thaw completely. Drain in a colander, but do not press liquid out.

I made this crisp from a rhubarb plant I have in my garden last week for a card party.
