Zucchini Cobbler

Crust

4 cups flour

1 ½ cups sugar

3 sticks butter or margarine

Blend together until like meal. Take out ½ cup crumbs & save. Press half of remaining crumbs into 11 X 16 pan and bake 10 mins at 375 degrees.

Filling

8 cups zucchini peeled and seeded

1 tsp apple extract

½ cup lemon juice

Slice and cook ingredients together for approximately 15 mins.

Add:

1 cup sugar

½ tsp cinnamon

 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp nutmeg

Reserved crumbs

1 Tbsp. cornstarch

Cook 1 more min. Spread over crust, sprinkle on reserved ½ cup crumbs and bake 30-40 mins at 350 degrees.

This recipe was given to me by my grandparents. The apple extract makes the zucchini taste like apple crisp! This is a great recipe for the fall harvest.

Nebraska Action Coalition

The Nebraska Action Coalition (NAC)-Future of Nursing cohosted a Culture of Health Summit with funding from Sigma Theta Tau International - Tau Tau Chapter and other generous funders on June 21 -22. The Summit Building on the Campaign for Action to Build a Healthier America was attended by Action Coalitions from across the country and their workgroups to further learn how to merge the recommendations of the Institute of Medicine's (IOM) report in 2010 on The Future of Nursing: Leading Change, Advancing Health with building a Culture of Health www.cultureofhealth.org. Over 80 participants from 21 states gathered in Omaha. Tau Tau representatives Janet Syslo, Deborah Conley, Dr. Alice Kindschuh, and Jed Hansen attended the reception June 21st at

Laurtizen Gardens. Jed Hansen also represented Nebraska Health Information Initiative (NeHII) which was a Summit sponsor. *Tau Tau* member and past Dean of the Nursing Department of Nebraska Methodist College, Marilyn Valario, has worked with NAC since its inception. She serves on the Executive Committee and as the NAC consultant.

Nebraska was chosen to host this nation-wide Summit because the NAC and collaborators, NNA, NONL, and NANDD were the first to host a Culture of Health Summit in October 2015. The Summit focused on engaging diverse stakeholders interested in a healthier Nebraska to brainstorm action steps. The report

can be accessed at www.neactioncoalition.org. It summarizes the work which took place across four Nebraska cities: Omaha, Lincoln, Kearney and Norfolk last fall.

Takeaways from the June 2016 Summit included further examination on how to crosswalk the IOM recommendations on advancing nursing education, practice, leadership, diversity, and data with the Culture of Health action framework which allows nursing to identify how to work with communities to make sure *everyone* is able to live the healthiest life possible.

Have you presented at a nursing or interdisciplinary conference/educational event since July 1, 2015? This may be a poster presentation or an oral presentation. If so, please let us know as to the presentation topic, conference, and date. We would also like a copy of your presentation to share with membership or a picture of your poster presentation with a brief synopsis.

Do you normally participate in any volunteer/services or philanthropic activities (i.e. the Alzheimer's Walk or Susan G. Komen Race for the Cure). If so, let us know, and possibly the Tau Tau chapter can form a team.

Tau Tau Member Recruitment

It's always a good time to recruit members to Tau Tau. New member induction occurs each November. Recruitment can occur in three different categories listed below. As Faculty Counselor, I recruit students enrolled in the undergraduate and graduate programs. I go to each junior and senior classroom to explain benefits of STTI membership and provide information about the application to students. Emails are sent to online RN to BSN students and graduate students. We would encourage everyone to think of an outstanding BSN or MSN nurse and invite them to join Tau Tau as a Nurse Leader. All you have to do is refer them to me, and I can get the information to them.

- * Undergraduate Student Junior or senior students enrolled in baccalaureate programs at accredited institutions of higher education who have completed at least 1/2 of the nursing curriculum, rank in the upper 35 percent of their graduating class and have achieved academic excellence (at schools where a 4.0 grade point average system is used, this equates to at least a 3.0).
- * Graduate Student Masters and Doctoral students enrolled in graduate programs at accredited institutions of higher education who have completed at least 1/4 of the nursing curriculum, have achieved academic excellence (schools where a 4.0 grade point average system is used, this equates to a 3.5).
- * Nurse Leader The candidates are legally recognized to practice in their countries, have at least a baccalaureate degree in nursing or other field and demonstrate achievement in nursing.




