Sigma Theta Tau International Honor Society of Nursing

In 1922 six nurses founded Sigma Theta Tau International, the Honor Society of Nursing, at the Indiana University Training School for Nurses, now the Indiana University School of Nursing, in Indianapolis, Indiana USA. The founders chose the name from the Greek words Storgé, Tharsos and Timé, meaning "love," "courage" and "honor".

Organizational Mission

The mission of the Sigma Theta Tau International Honor Society of Nursing is to support the learning, knowledge and professional development of nurses committed to making a difference in health worldwide.

Society Vision

The vision of the Honor Society of Nursing, Sigma Theta Tau International is to create a global community of nurses who lead in using knowledge, scholarship, service and learning to improve the health of the world's people.

From its inception, STTI has recognized the value of scholarship and excellence in nursing practice. In 1936, STTI became the first U.S. organization to fund nursing research. Today, STTI supports these values through its numerous professional development services that focus on the core areas of education, leadership, career development, evidence-based nursing, research and scholarship. These services advance the learning and professional development of members and all nurses who strive to improve the health of the world's people:

- STTI, with its grant partners (corporations, associations and foundations), contributes more than US \$200,000 annually to nursing research through grants, scholarships and monetary awards.
- A number of education and research conferences are supported by STTI, including a yearly research congress that presents the latest nursing research from around the world and a biennial convention that offers nursing's best practices in clinical, scientific and leadership areas.
- Online continuing education offers peer-reviewed, interactive learning
 activities which are presented in a variety of learning formats
 including case studies, evidence-based articles and module
 courses. These activities are web-linked to full-text articles and
 abstracts and are available for continuing education contact hours.
