#### Sigma Theta Tau International Honor Society of Nursing

In 1922 six nurses founded Sigma Theta Tau International Honor Society of Nursing, at the Indiana University Training School for Nurses (now the Indiana University School of Nursing) in Indianapolis, Indiana USA. The founders chose the name from the Greek words Storgé, Tharsos and Timé, meaning "love," "courage" and "honor".

The University of Wisconsin Oshkosh College of Nursing inducted its first members into the Nursing Honor Society in 1981, and in 1982 applied to join Sigma Theta Tau International Honor Society of Nursing. The Eta Pi Chapter charter was granted in 1984 and the Charter Members were inducted on April 27, 1984.

#### **Organizational Mission**

The mission of the Sigma Theta Tau International Honor Society of Nursing (Sigma) is advancing world health and celebrating nursing excellence in scholarship, leadership and service.

#### **Society Vision**

Sigma's vision is to be the global organization of choice for nursing.

From its inception, Sigma has recognized the value of scholarship and excellence in nursing practice. In 1936, Sigma became the first U.S. organization to fund nursing research. Today, Sigma supports these values through its numerous professional development services that focus on the core areas of education, leadership, career development, evidence-based nursing, research and scholarship. These services advance the learning and professional development of members and all nurses who strive to improve the health of the world's people:

- Sigma, with its grant partners (corporations, associations and foundations), contributes more than US \$200,000 annually to nursing research through grants, scholarships and monetary awards.
- A number of education and research conferences are supported by Sigma, including a yearly research congress that presents the latest nursing research from around the world and a biennial convention that offers nursing's best practices in clinical, scientific and leadership areas.
- Online continuing education offers peer-reviewed, interactive learning activities
   which are presented in a variety of learning formats including case studies,
   evidence-based articles and module courses. These activities are weblinked to full-text articles and abstracts and are available for continuing
   education contact hours.
