We need you . . .

The SONA Nominating Committee invites you to submit your name as a candidate for one of the following leadership positions in the Southwestern Ohio Nurses Association. This is an opportunity to serve your profession and have an impact on its future, to participate in decisions related to nursing and health care, to learn the inner workings of the professional organization at the district and state levels, and to influence the image of nursing.

Terms of office are for two years: June 2016 - June 2018

PRESIDENT

To be eligible for the office of the president a nominee must currently or have previously served on the Executive Board or Board of Directors and be an active member of SONA; Shall chair the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee; Presides over meetings of SONA; Provides for the recording of minutes, the completion of required reports and maintenance of official records; May delegate assignments to the officers and Board of Directors; and serves as SONA representative to the ONA Leadership Forum. The president shall be designated as a delegate to the ONA Convention and is an ex-officio member of all committees except the Nominating Committee.

TREASURER

Assure payment of bills of the district approved by the Board of Directors; Provide a fiscal report to the membership and to the Board of Directors; Keep financial records to allow an audit; Balance and reconcile

revenues and expenses; Report to the Board of Directors the financial standing of SONA at each BOD meeting.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS (3 To be elected)

Members meet every month to transact the business of the Association in accordance with its mission and purposes; act as liaisons to standing committees; initiate action on a variety of professional issues of personal/professional interest; communicate action and direct recommendations for action to SONA committees and ONA Board of Directors when needed.

NOMINATION COMMITTEE (3 to be elected)

Members prepare a slate of candidates for election which is then submitted to the SONA Board and general membership for completion; facilitate the mail ballot voting by membership; determine election results; and notify membership of results. This is a one year term.

Interested individuals should submit your name by completing the Consent-to-Serve form below and return it by May 2, 2016 with your bio. The slate will be finalized and sent out for a vote with May newsletter.

A Message from our President

A note from your President on what has been happening since our last newsletter. First I want to thank the SONA members who were able to attend the ONA Convention in October of 2015. While we did not have a full complement of delegates, more members did serve in this capacity than in the past few conventions. The district did support members as delegates by paying for registration and hotel rooms (double occupancy). In addition, several of our delegates ran for and won positions on the ONA BOD -Brian Burger 2nd VP and Jeannette Potter Director; ANA Non-voting Delegate – Brian Burger and myself; NFN Delegate - Brian Burger; E&GW Commissioner - Jeannette Porter; AFT Delegate - Brian Burger, Jeannette Porter, Robert Weitzel, Cheryl Wigner, Erica Burger and Sammie Schweighart. This is an exceptional showing of representation from SONA and the UCMC local unit.

At the ONA level, two SONA members currently serve on the Governance and Dues Task Force Sub-Committees- myself and Robert Weitzel. This task force is charged with looking at other ways to structure ONA besides the current district format, i.e. regions, and reducing/simplifying the number of dues rates. Two SONA members also serve on the Staffing Task Force – Brian Burger and myself. This task force is charged with addressing the issue of staffing at the bedside. Additionally, I represent ONA on the Ohio Action Coalition Steering Committee along with two other ONA representatives. The Coalition is responsible for implementing the recommendations from the IOM Future of Nursing report.

I encourage all SONA members to become involved at some level of their professional organization -SONA, ONA, and ANA. There are many opportunities, with varying time commitments, allowing for direct input on how you practice and influence the future of healthcare.

In October, 2015, the Human Rights Committee moved the Nurses Clinic from the Drop-In-Center to the new Barron Center for homeless men. Our services include assessment related to chief complaint, over the counter medications and treatment, referrals, and limited social service assistance. The clinic area includes 3 treatment rooms, medication room, lab room, and reception desk. The clinic location is secured and requires a key card to enter. Patient visits to the clinic have increased creating a need for 3 nurse volunteers to be present each week. We collaborate with the Medical/Pharmacy students, who have their clinic after us, by referring patients that need some additional assessment. In late January, 2016, the McMicken Clinic opened services at the Barron on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 7 AM to 12 PM. Patients seen in the Nurse Clinic that require a more in-depth assessment and treatment are referred to the McMicken Clinic. For more emergent needs, patients are sent to the ER via taxi or EMS as appropriate. Documentation of a patient's visit to the Nurse Clinic will soon be done via computer. The program will also allow access to other healthcare information entered by Case Managers at the Barron.

Recently, two UCMC nurses needing community clinical hours for the Clinical Ladder have volunteered at the Nurse Clinic and were provided documentation for their packet. We welcome the opportunity to assist nurses in meeting their clinical ladder requirements. We are actively looking for new volunteers to assist in operating the new clinic. If you would consider joining this project please call SONA at 513-426-6582 or email info@sonanet.org to set up a time to come to the clinic during a Tuesday afternoon from 4-6pm.

- 8. Demonstrates professional qualities in nursing.

EXCELLENCE IN NURSING ADMINISTRATION

Recognizes the outstanding performance of a nurse administrator in a health care facility. Criteria:

- 1. Is employed in the field of nursing administration.
- 2. Has instituted a system of change that improved health services and enhanced the ability of nurses to practice.
- 3. Demonstrates professional qualities in nursing.
- 4. Demonstrates the ability to collaborate with other health disciplines to provide comprehensive patient care.
- 5. Demonstrates ability to influence political arenas for the improvement of health care services.
- 6. Has made contributions to, and encourages involvement in, the professional association.

EXCELLENCE IN NURSING EDUCATION ADMINISTRATION

Recognizes the unique accomplishments of a current SONA member in nursing education administration in an approved college or school of nursing and/or continuing education program. Criteria:

- 1. Presently employed in a position of nursing education administration.
- 2. Shows leadership in instituting nursing education among faculty and with learners.
- 3. Demonstrates innovation in nursing education.
- 4. Influences other nurses to excel in nursing education.
- 5. Demonstrates the ability to collaborate with others in the health care industry to enhance the health care of others.
- 6. Has made a contribution to, and encourages involvement in SONA, ONA or ANA.
- 7. Demonstrates professional qualities in nursing.

EXCELLENCE IN NURSING EDUCATION

Recognizes the unique accomplishments of a SONA member who teaches in any approved college or school of nursing and/or continuing education program. Criteria:

- 1. Is employed in a position of nursing education.
- 2. Is able to establish and maintain a positive rapport with learners.
- 3. Plans, implements and evaluates an innovative teaching program for learners.
- 4. Provides a means for learner evaluation of the teaching program.
- 5. Receives documentation of peer/learner evaluations of teaching effectiveness.
- 6. Has made a contribution to and encourages involvement in the professional association.
- 7. Demonstrates professional qualities in nursing.

Nursing Education Nursing Administration

The Mary Hamer Greenwood Award is named after one of the principal founders of the Graduate Nurses Association of Cincinnati, now known as the Southwestern Ohio Nurses Association (SONA).

In 1897, she and other nursing superintendents called a meeting to discuss: 1) how to provide quality nursing care, and 2) how to safely select a nurse, since anyone who wanted to adopt that type of work could use the title "nurse." Thirty nurses attended that historic meeting, and formed the graduate nurses association in Ohio. Cincinnati nurses believed that those who completed a program of study in nursing should have a certificate or license. The leadership of the Cincinnati Graduate Nurses Association, realized that a statewide effort was needed to reach that goal, and membership was opened to all Ohio nurses. In 1904, the Ohio State Graduate Nurses Association was formed, and Mary Hamer Greenwood was its first president. The state Association became the Ohio Nurses' Association.
