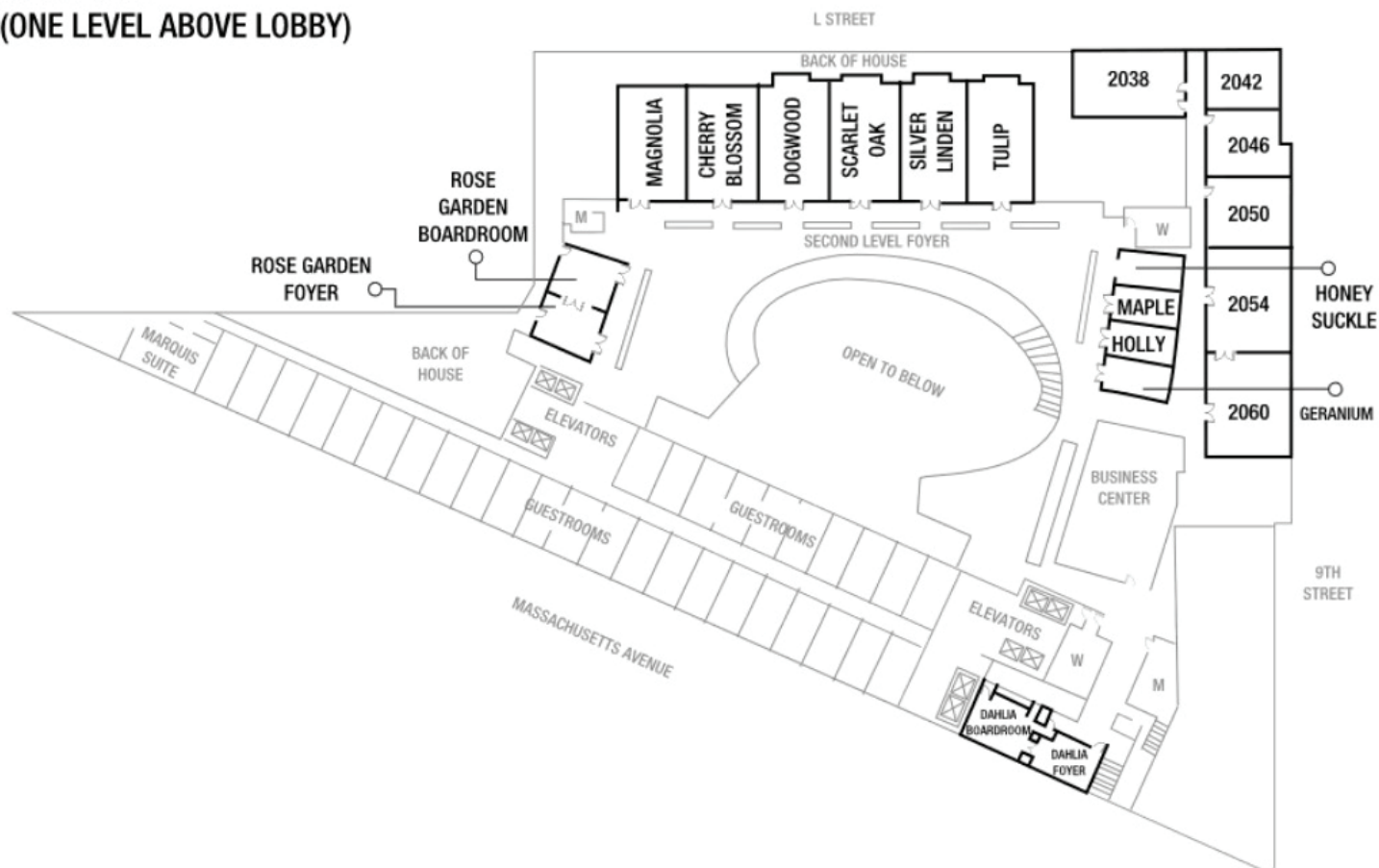

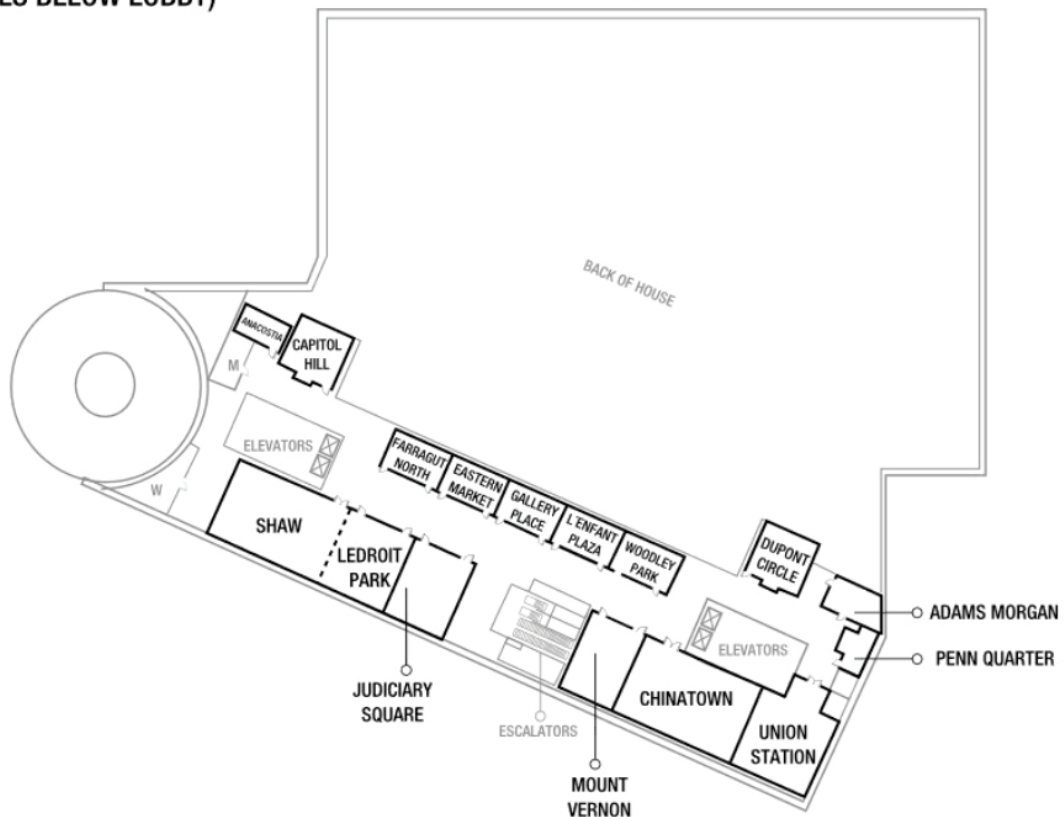

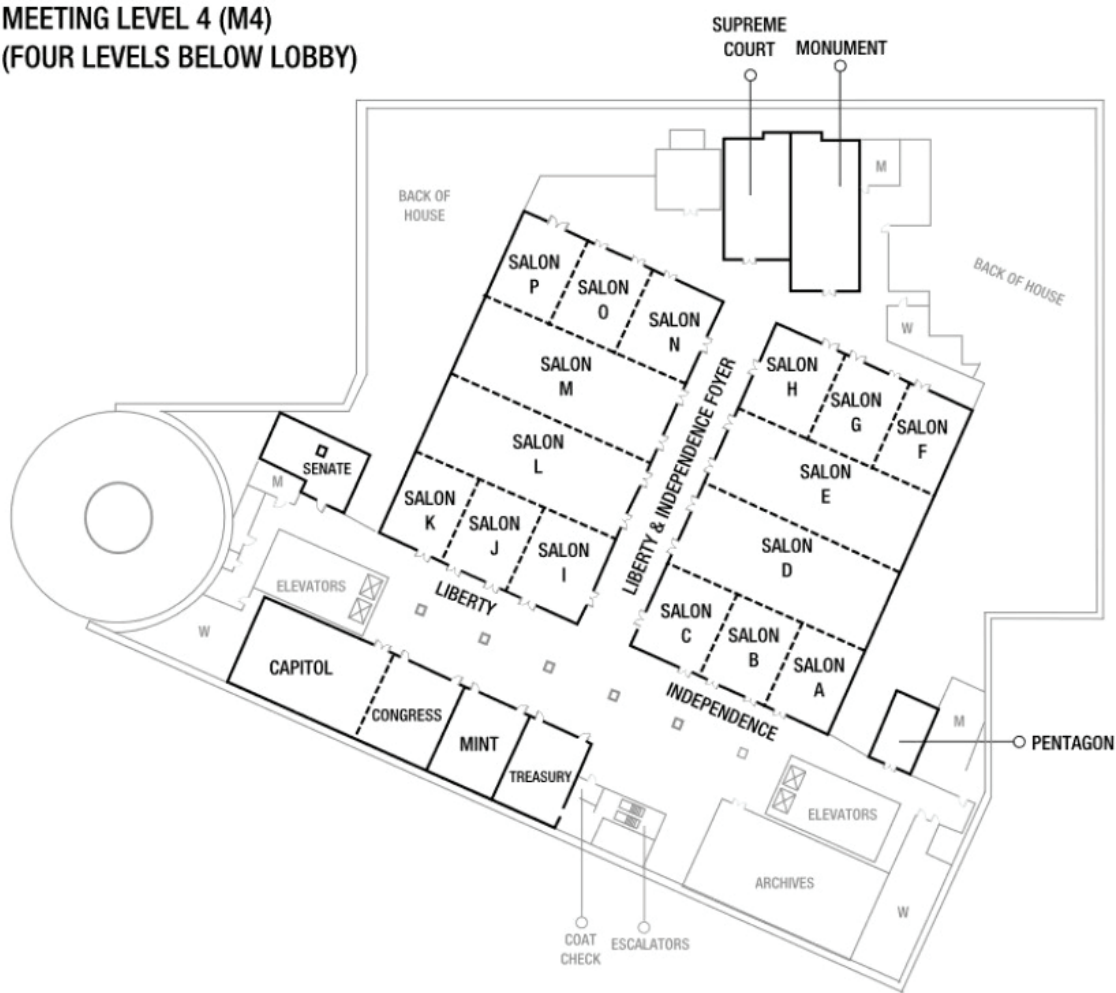


MEETING LEVEL 3 (M3)

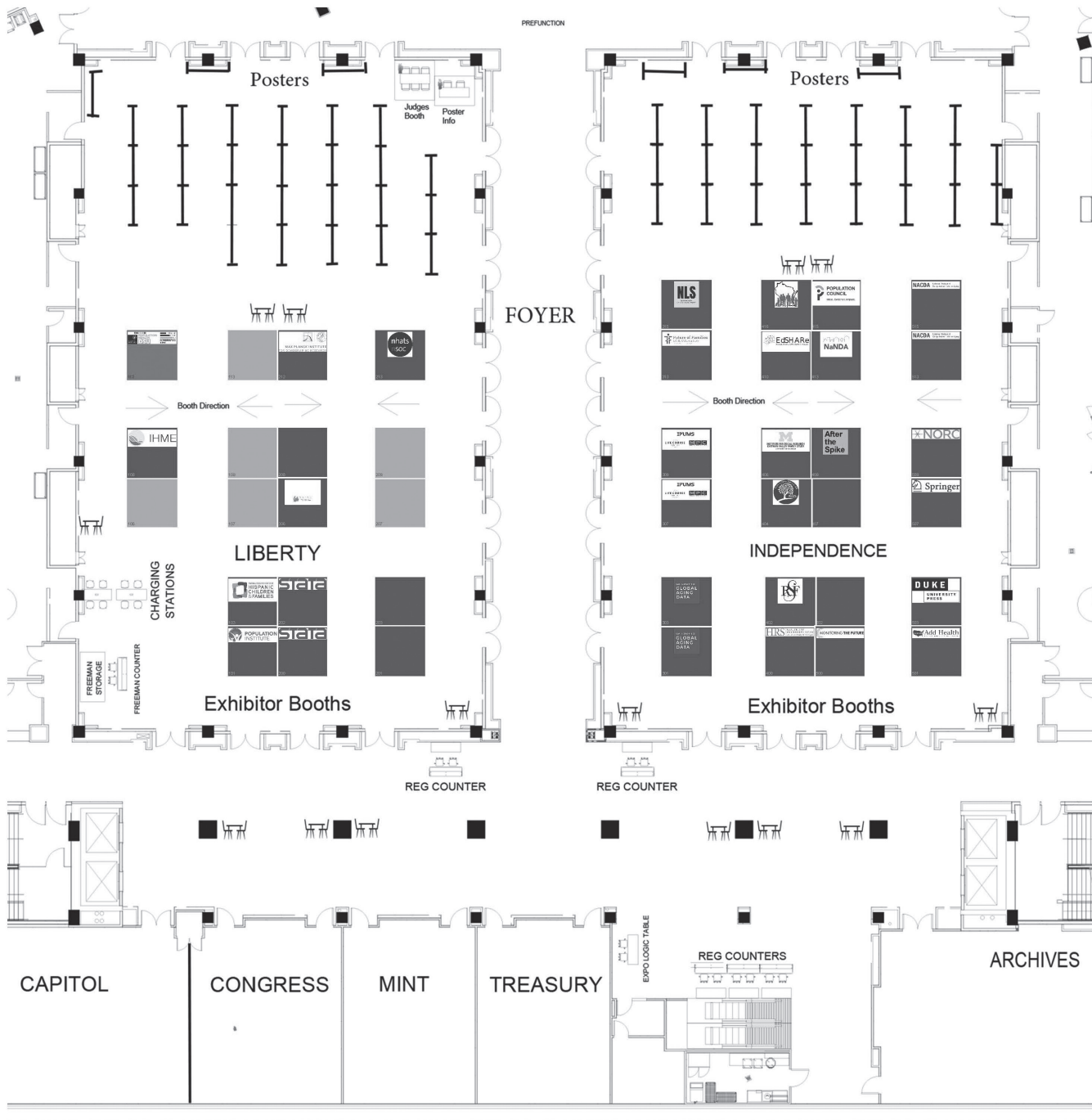
