

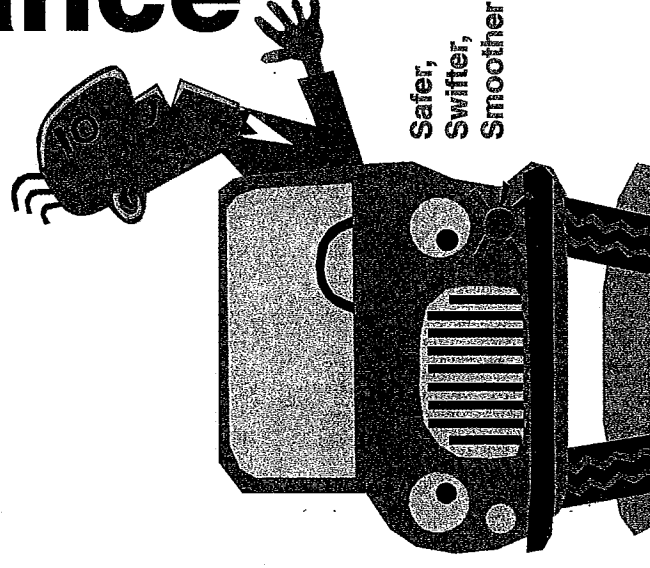
Roadway Conditions to Report

- **Potholes/Sinkholes**
Any sizeable cracks or blemishes in the roadway should be reported.
- **Shoulder Deterioration**
Drop-offs, erosion and washouts should be reported.
- **Water and icy Spots**
Water running onto or across the roadway can create icy spots in the winter and hydroplaning conditions in the summer and it should be reported.
- **Damaged Guiderail**
Any guiderail with missing, damaged or bent sections should be reported. Any damaged guiderail ends or crash cushions should also be reported.
- **Signs**
Damaged, obscured, distorted or missing signs should be reported.
- **Work Zone Problems**
All work zone problems should be reported even if the work is being performed by someone other than PENNDOT.
- **Vegetation Control**
If overgrown vegetation is hindering sight distance at intersection, it should be reported.
- **Deer Removal**
Call 1-800-FIX-ROAD for animal carcass removal.
- **Other Conditions**
Boulders, trees and other large objects on the roadway should be reported.

**Use your best judgment.
If you're concerned, report it!**

PENNDOT has made great strides in roadway maintenance by aggressively pursuing maintenance strategies to improve ride quality on all State Roads; however, some unanticipated conditions may still occur. PENNDOT's maintenance crews are constantly scanning the roads to identify potential problems, but with about 40,000 miles of State Roadways to maintain, we can't be everywhere at once. That's why we need your help. When you're out driving, keep your eyes open and promptly report any problems you see on the roadway. By doing so, you will be helping our maintenance crews repair the problem sooner and prevent potential crashes – in other words, you may be saving a life. You, the PENNDOT customer are our **“Extra Eyes.”**

How do I Report?

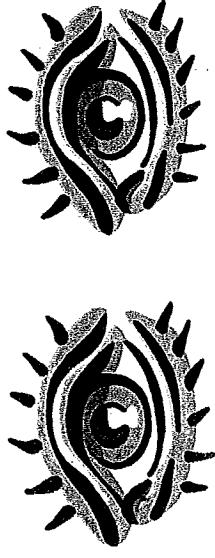
PENNDOT has made it easy for its customers to report maintenance concerns. The **1-800-FIX-ROAD** number will direct the caller to the respective county maintenance office where the call can be addressed properly. It's that simple.

Why Report?

As PENNDOT customers and Pennsylvania residents, it is important that we all work together to make our transportation system as safe and mobile as possible. By reporting these conditions to PENNDOT, you can help us achieve that goal.



What do I Report?

Use caution if you see something that may appear to be a possible problem. Drive defensively and make a mental note of the location. Landmarks or segment markers are the best form of identification. If you cannot easily see a segment marker then look for other landmarks such as buildings, recreational areas, etc. Location is the most important information because it allows PENNDOT crews to address the concern quickly.

Location Identifiers:

- Provide State Route (SR) and segment number (see photo markers are small white signs along roadway) in photo below, this is SR 259 Segment 70.

- Refer to any landmarks, intersections or unique signs
