

## About the RPT exams...

Registered Piano Technicians are professionals who have committed themselves to the continual pursuit of excellence, both in technical service and ethical conduct. The Piano Technicians Guild grants the Registered Piano Technician (RPT) credential after a series of rigorous examinations that test skill in piano tuning, regulation and repair. Those capable of performing these tasks up to a recognized worldwide standard receive the RPT credential.

No organization has done more to upgrade the profession of the piano technician than PTG. The work done by PTG members in developing the RPT Exams has been a major contribution to the advancement of higher standards in the field. The written, tuning and technical exams are available exclusively to PTG members in good standing.

### Written Exam

The written exam has questions covering all phases of piano technology divided into four sections: Tuning, Regulation and Action Function, Repairs and Voicing / General Information. This exam takes about one hour.

### Technical Exam

This exam is in three parts: Grand Regulation, Vertical Regulation, and Repairs. The regulation sections are done on action models testing specific regulation skills. The repair tasks are all common ones routinely performed by the average technician, such as key bushing, hammer shaping, string replacement and splicing, hammershank rebushing/repinning, and vertical shank replacement. This exam takes about 4 hours.

### Tuning Exam

This exam compares your tuning to a “master tuning” done by a team of examiners on the same piano you will tune. Electronic Tuning Aids are used to measure the master tuning and to measure your tuning for comparison. In Part 1 you aurally tune the middle two octaves, using a non-visual source for A440. In Part 2 you tune the remaining octaves by any method you choose, including the use of Electronic Tuning Aids. This exam takes about 4 hours.

### Find an Examiner

Check with your local chapter president or examination committee chair first to see if there are local opportunities. Exam sites include local chapters, Area Examination Boards, regional conferences and the Annual PTG Convention & Technical Institute. ### Purchase an Exam Voucher

You should purchase an exam voucher for the tuning and technical exams at least ten days before taking your exam. Present it to the examiner along with your current PTG membership card. There is no cost for taking the RPT written exam.
