Legislative Update

Asbestos/Silica Legislation: Senator Kyle Janek has filed SB 15 and Rep. Joe Nixon has filed HB 8 addressing asbestos and silica litigation abuse. The two bills are similar in requiring that a fair and sensible medical threshold be met before lawsuits go forward. Both bills extend the statute of limitations so that any person who becomes ill in the future will have the right to pursue a lawsuit. The House Civil Practices Committee has held a hearing on this legislation. The Senate hearing in the State Affairs Committee is expected to take place soon.

Appeal on Controlling Questions of Law: HB 1294 by Rep. Patrick Rose. This legislation would allow appeals from trial courts to appellate courts to allow fundamental questions of law to be decided before lawsuits go to trial. This would greatly improve the time and cost efficiency of certain cases. This bill has been heard in the House Civil Practices Committee and awaits further legislative action.

Arbitration Limitations: TLR continues to monitor legislation and amendments to legislation that might damage the ability of parties to enter into arbitration agreements. Arbitration was first established as an alternative to lawsuits in 1925. The U.S. Supreme Court has repeatedly upheld the concept of faster and less expensive alternatives to litigation. Arbitration agreements nonetheless continue to be the target of legislative efforts to weaken or eliminate this option.

WORKERS' COMPENSATION RE-FORM BILL PASSES TEXAS HOUSE

House Bill 7, the workers' compensation reform bill authored by Chairman Burt Solomons, just preliminarily passed the full House of Representatives by a vote of 144-3. (Only Representatives Geren, Herrero, and Leibowitz voted no).

The bill is expected to be finally passed by the printing of this newsletter

HB 7 creates networks of credentialed health providers to treat injured workers and will improve health care access and results, get injured workers back on the job in a timely fashion and help contain health care costs.

When HB7 is finally passed, differences between it and Senate Bill 5 will need to be worked out by a conference committee.

- 1. Parent/Guardian of applicant must be a current Houston RIMS Chapter Deputy Member.

 - be less than 25 years of age at the beginning of the current school year (Sept 1, 2005).
