Business Network of Emergency Resources – (BNET Inc.) 501(c)

Not-for-profit organization dedicated to establishing practical and effective emergency and crisis management solutions through partnerships between the public and private sector.





What Does Access Accomplish?



- Gets essential personnel, critical supplies and services into the effected area
- Gives businesses a vital head start to recover
- Restores essential lifelines
 - Utilities, Food, Money, Supplies
- Gives the community a head start to recover
 - Gets people back to work
 - · Gets children back to school

Corporate Emergency Access System

- Credentialing system validates private sector <u>critical employees</u>
- Allows access to restricted areas and travel during emergencies when safety permits prior to reentry of the general public - Gov. control
- Variety of card types to suit needs
- Levels of activation
- Limits of card amounts based on FTE's at facility
- Credential highly resistance to unauthorized duplication

Participant's Requirements

- Indemnification
- Insurance
- Purchase of Cards
- Assign Employee Limited Information Collection:
 Name, Photo, Place of Employment, E-mail



Participant's Management

- Company Coordinator
 - Person assigned to manage CEAS program with for the Company / Point of Contact for BNET.
 - Documentation
 - Assigns Cardholders
 - Monitors training Cardholder Training
 - Manages card turnover
 - Complies with program requirements
 - Revokes/Recovers expired/unneeded cards
 - Application (approved by BNET*)

*except for All Area Access Cards



BNET's Responsibilities

- Reviews and approves applications
- Enforces jurisdictional program policy
- Provides training to end users
- Prints and distributes cards to Coordinators
- Maintain live database
- Provides access and reporting to Corporate Coordinators & Municipal Administrators
- Provides all back office services
- Provides telephone and e-mail support

Types of Cards

- Standard Card- photo identification card issued to a specific Critical Employee and/or Essential Service Provider for access to a single primary work location They are address-based. Price: \$50 for 2 years.
- Multi-Facility Card- photo identification card issued to a specific Critical Employee and/or Essential Service Provider for access to ALL facilities within the sponsoring jurisdiction. Price: \$100 for 2 years.
- Flex Card- none photo identification card intended to provide additional flexibility. Requires a secondary form of government issued photo identification and proof of employment by the company. *Employers may request up to 25% of their eligible Cards to be issued as Flex Cards.

Price: \$70 for 2 years.

All Area Access Card- photo identification card issued to a specific Essential Service Provider within a specially defined group of businesses that provides access anywhere within the sponsoring jurisdiction. *Cards require direct approval by juridiction.
 Price: \$100 for 2 years.




Current Card Options

Cards are allotted based on a percentage of employees at a specific work address*

Benefits to Business

- Assess damage, begin restoration
- Mitigate damage to facility
- Restore critical operations and customer services
- Move key resources and personnel
- Rescue vaulted assets, vital records
- Power down networks, mainframes & servers
- Retrieve laptops, servers
- Preserve vital research
- Low cost solution



Benefits to Government

- CEAS is a springboard to stronger publicprivate partnerships
- Allows recovery of vital lifelines
- Faster economic recovery (macro) from a regional event
- Faster social recovery (puts people back to work quicker)
- Provides an effective decision making tool for law enforcement without loss of control
- No Cost CEAS is a win-win for everyone, operationally and politically



Public Sector -How CEAS Work?

- CEAS must be activated by public officials via announcement during an emergency event before cards are accepted for access
 - The Police are ALWAYS in charge regardless of activation level issued
- CEAS has various Levels of Activation
 - · Level "C" Critical Infrastructure, Critical Industries
 - · Level "B" Non-Critical / All Businesses
 - Level "A" Driving Restrictions
 - · Level "X" Not Activated / Activation Ended

Private Sector - How Does CEAS Work?

- The jurisdictions will notify BNet of an emergency event or use local media and their standard notification channels to make public notification.
- The Coordinator will receive activation notifications from BNET including location, <u>access level</u> and detailed information regarding <u>access point(s)</u> including any other important information
- > Send Word Now is BNET's notification tool
- The Corporate Coordinator is the primary point of contact and is responsible to communicate the activation to personnel Self Deployment is strongly discouraged

Final Thoughts

- BNet exists for one reason only... create programs intended to mitigate damage to economic lifelines that affect communities recovering from a disaster by getting businesses up and running as quickly as possible

- Consider an emergency re-entry/access plan as an annex to your BC Plans
