The SIM Foundation is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization connected to the Society for Information Management. The purpose of the organization is to increase philanthropy on a national level with an emphasis on STEM education and to enable local SIM chapters in their efforts to give back to organizations that benefit causes in their local communities. The Foundation facilitates these efforts by collaborating with two STEM-based organizations, FIRST and NPower, and amplifies the chapter giving with matching grants.

FIRST® is the world's leading youth-serving nonprofit advancing STEM education. Through a suite of inclusive, team-based robotics programs for ages 4-18 and backed by a global network of mentors, coaches, volunteers, alumni, and sponsors, FIRST has a proven impact on learning, interest, and skill-building inside and outside of the classroom. For over 30 years, students from all walks of life have developed self-confidence in STEM and valuable, real-world skills through FIRST that open pathways to a better future.

Hands-On STEM Learning Programs for Every Age

FIRST® LEGO® League - Grades PreK-8, Ages 4-16

FIRST® LEGO® League introduces STEM to children through fun, exciting handson learning. Participants gain real-world problem-solving experiences through a guided, global robotics program.

FIRST® Tech Challenge - Grades 7-12, Ages 12-18

FIRST® Tech Challenge students learn to think like engineers by working in teams to design, build, and program robots to compete in an alliance format against other teams. Robots are built from a reusable platform, powered by Android technology, and can be coded using a variety of programming languages.

FIRST® Robotics Competition - Grades 9-12, Ages 14-18

FIRST® Robotics Competition teams design, program, and build industrial-sized robots from scratch with a kit of parts and a common set of rules to play a different game every season. Teams also create a team identity, develop community partnerships for support, and work to promote STEM in their local community. Participants and alumni have access to education and career discovery opportunities, connections to scholarships and employers, and a place in the FIRST community for life.

PROBLEMS WE'RE SOLVING

- Too few young adults from underserved communities and veterans have the skills or access to launch successful careers in the digital economy, limiting their opportunity to participate in the workforce and build a strong financial future.
- There is an inadequate pipeline of skilled, diverse employees prepared to meet the demands of the digital labor market.

WHY IS THIS IMPORTANT?

In today's economy, over 50% of all jobs require some degree of technology and digital skill. Of the nearly 6 million jobs expected to require tech skills in the future, labor statistics project a candidate pool of only 3.2 million.








SIM Friends of the Foundation Giveback Impact
