Louise Leckner Memorial Travel Stipends

Since 2009, IOP Publishing, a generous and long-time supporter of libraries and librarians, has provided funding for new PAM librarians with up to four stipends to help defray the costs of traveling to the SLA Annual Conference. In 2013, the PAM Travel Stipends were renamed the Louise Leckner Memorial Travel Stipends to memorialize our dear friend and colleague. Louise was so proud to be a part of this program which supports new librarians and deepens the relationships between those librarians and the PAM Division.

We asked that applicants be graduates of a library science program, have less than three years of professional professional library information experience in a PAM discipline, be employed by a library focusing on one or more of the PAM disciplines or as a subject specialist for one or more of these disciplines, and be first- or second-time attendees of the annual conference.

I am happy to announce the recipients of the Louise Leckner Memorial Travel Stipend for 2019: Mark Chalmers, Meg Eastwood, Evan Meszaros, and Sarah Siddiqui!

Mark Chalmers holds an undergraduate degree in astrophysics and recently started as a Science and Engineering Librarian at the University of Cincinnati after being awarded his MLIS in May 2018. His liaison areas include physics, mathematics, and multiple engineering disciplines. Mark's main areas of focus over the past months have been collection development for physics, engineering, and math, working with UC's STEM special collections, and integrating with the research and data services team. As a new member of SLA, Mark joined the Cincinnati chapter and PAM division, and is serving on the PAM hospitality committee for the SLA 2019 conference.

Meg Eastwood's work at the University of Denver Libraries focuses on reference and instruction, but she also helps faculty and students with questions about data management and scholarly communications. Meg has a BA in Biology from Grinnell College and an MS in Information Studies from The University of Texas at Austin. In the years between those degrees, she worked as a field assistant for ecological studies and as a lab prep/RA for the Shoals Marine Lab on Appledore Island, ME. Meg's previous library positions include being a science librarian at the University of New Hampshire and at Northern Arizona University.

Evan Meszaros is a Research Services Librarian at the Kelvin Smith Library of Case Western Reserve University, where he is the liaison to the Departments of Astronomy, Biology, and Earth, Environmental, & Planetary Sciences, as well as the Institute for the Science of Origins. Evan completed his MA in Library & Information Studies from the University of Wisconsin-Madison's Information School in May 2018. Prior to his time in libraries, he completed a BA in the natural sciences from Lawrence University and an MS in biology from Case Western Reserve, where he subsequently worked as a bench scientist in the Dept. of Medicine for a number of years. Evan is thrilled to be attending his first SLA Annual Conference this summer!

Sarah Siddiqui is a Science and Engineering Outreach Librarian at the University of Rochester. Her departments include Mathematics, Mechanical Engineering and Materials Science, along with the Laboratory for Laser Energetics (LLE). She is also actively involved in the River Campus Libraries' TinkerSpace program, which offers workshops for soldering and using technologies such as MATLAB, Arduino, Raspberry Pi, and more. Sarah is the current treasurer for the Upstate New York chapter of SLA. She received her MS in Information Science from the University at Albany in 2018, and was a graduate assistant in the Libraries' Preservation department. She's from India, where she received her undergraduate degree in Business Administration.
