

Purpose

- Identify issues and challenges that may confront our region in the event of a disaster

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

Memorandum of Understanding for Emergency Preparedness Support for the Bethesda Medical Libraries Emergency Preparedness Partnership, 2008

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is a mutual aid agreement and a totally voluntary program between cooperating 'partner' libraries.

Purpose:

The purpose of the MOU is to establish a working relationship between hospital or health system 'partner' libraries as follows:

- NIH Library, National Institutes of Health
- Medical Library, Fort Belvoir Community Hospital
- Darnall Medical Library, Walter Reed National Military Medical Center
- Learning Resource Center, Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USHUS)
- support from the Disaster Information Management Research Center, Specialized Information Services Division, National Library of Medicine.

- Non-binding
- Voluntary
- Guidance only

- For how long would those services be unavailable?
- In such a scenario, would your users require more, less, or the same amount of information?
- What would be the consequences of not offering library services, not responding to requests, etc.?
