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Getting Started

- ♦ Get lots of permissions. To use work time, to spend money, to get access to the studio, to get a partner.
- Plan! How often will you record, using what software for editing, etc? Are you going to follow a specific set of guidelines (language, policies)?
- ♦ Create a process. Write it down.
- ♦ Download all the editing software. (We use Audacity).



Recording in The Studio

- ♦ Focusrite Clarett 8PreX (~ \$1,000)
- ♦ 2 Genelec 8030 studio monitors with 7050 subwoofer (~ \$2,400)
- ♦ 2 Electro-Voice RE20 microphones (~ \$1,300)
- ♦ 2 microphone stands (~ \$200)
- ◇ 2 pop screens (~ \$20)
- ♦ Audition software (~ \$250/year)
- Building a sound resistant space (~ \$100,000)



Editing/Transcripts

Exhausting, nerve wracking, and yes, you really sound like that. At least it is free! *

*Transcripts are expensive, time consuming, and you'll probably have to sign a contract with a provider.





Partnership

Biggest key is finding someone that you like to talk to, and far more importantly, like to listen to.

Plan

- ♦ Script? No script?
- Don't sandbag your partner.
- Write down a list of topics that you can later ignore when more interesting things come up.



Best Practices

Communicate


With your partner, your boss, your editors, and yourself. Question what you are doing in a positive light.

Prepare for Change

Dump ideas that are not working! Life is too short to hate doing something this fun.

Ask For Feedback

When you ask for opinions, listen. When people say things that make you feel something, examine those feelings.

Excitement when you hear the first episode!!
