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LibQUAL+™ and the Professional Military Library

Professional military education (PME) libraries serve the students, staff, and faculty of the nation's post-graduate military colleges. Six of these special libraries participated in the Spring 2003 LibQUAL+™, sponsored by the Association of Research Libraries and Texas A&M University. LibQUAL+™ is one of several New Measures Initiatives sponsored by ARL. This particular initiative enables similar libraries to "solicit, track, understand, and act upon users' opinions of service quality." Survey data will enable participants to assess whether or not library services are meeting, exceeding, or falling short of users' expectations. The data also allows similar institutions to identify strengths and weaknesses among the group, at specific institutions, and to develop targeted service solutions.

In this fourth administration of the LibQUAL+™ protocol, 1,697 library users participated from the following military schools: Air University, Army War College, Joint Forces Staff College, National Defense University, Naval Postgraduate School, and the Naval War College. The majority of the PME libraries' survey population can be categorized as follows: students with masters degrees or higher (62%); primarily male (85%); ages 31 – 65 (94%). These customers joined together with participants in over 300 institutions in the United States, Canada, and the United Kingdom to rate four domains of library service on a nine-point scale. These domains were (1) access to information; (2) affect of service; (3) library as place; and (4) personal control.

In almost every dimension of measured service quality, the military school libraries met or exceeded users' service expectations. For example, in the "affect of service" area, with questions probing staff members' willingness to help, dependability, courtesy, and knowledge of subject area, the military libraries exceeded users' expectations across the board.

This paper explores the military library environment to identify factors that may contribute to the positive perceptions of library service, and examines practical applications for other special libraries. A Member Passes

Teri Bolling Fletcher Newsome (1952-2004)

Teri Newsome was the division point of contact for the 2004 Military Librarians Workshop (MLW) to be held in Columbia and hosted by DOD with the assistance of the Army libraries at Fort Jackson. She is missed by her colleagues and friends. The Chaplain Center and School Library will be renamed and dedicated in her honor during MLW 2004.

"Mrs. Newsome was the daughter of Gladys Bolling Fletcher and the late Lt. Col. Henri Frank Fletcher of Hampton, Virginia. Born May 1, 1952 in Anchorage, Alaska, raised in Hampton, Virginia, she was a graduate of Pembroke High School and North Carolina A&T in Greensboro, NC, receiving her B.S. and Master's degree in Physical Education. She later received a Master's in Library Science from the University of Michigan at Ann Arbor, Michigan.

She had a distinguished career as a civilian employee with the United States Army for over 21 years while serving as Chief Librarian with the United States Army Chaplain Center and School, where she was instrumental in the relocation of the school's library from Fort Monmouth, NJ to Fort Jackson in Columbia, SC, and further distinguishing herself by being a graduate of the Army Management Staff College."

From a letter by a former supervisor, reprinted in part with her permission: "I went to Teri's funeral today. It was lovely, and the church was full.

Areena Lowe came up from the Staff College, Ray Abell, Karen Lewis, Shirley (Stillwell) Lindsay, Jim Bradley, Lenora Haughton, Linda Kennedy, and Sandy Byrn were there.

As we entered, an usher asked if we were "the army librarians" and sat us in the front row, across the aisle from the family. ... They had us file out after the service, just before the casket, each carrying one of the floral arrangements that had been set around Teri's casket. An entry in the program read, "Floral Bearers: Fort Monroe Army Librarians". There was a beautiful arrangement from the Army Library Program Office (Ann Parham). These went outside where the funeral staff took charge of them, but it was rather sweet to find a way for all of Teri's co-workers to participate as a group.

Her husband, LaMonte spoke, as did her sister Brenda. They both did beautifully. I teared up when Brenda spoke because her voice is so like Teri's. A sad day, but all went beautifully."

DTIC Annual User Conference – 28 Mar - 2 Apr 2004

The 2004 DTIC User Conference was fast-paced, but gave attendees time to absorb some of the information provided in programs, visit vendors, and network. A good mix of librarians, information professionals, managers, vendors, and DTIC staff were present. User concerns, most voiced before the conference, were addressed at the highest levels within DTIC. As the conference met, DTIC was about to be reorganized under ODDR&E, Office of the Director of Defense Research and Engineering. Now that DTIC has been created a DOD Field Operating Agency, it should get additional visibility, clout, and money needed to support DOD Science and Technology research.

Some of the highlights of the conference were:

1. E Gov Act of 2004, PL 107-347, Section 207 (g) mandates that all federal activities will report research funding. Mandates information re-use. <http://thomas.loc.gov/cgi-bin/bdquery/z?d107:HR02458:@@@D&summ2=m&|TOM:/bss/d107query.html|Search Thomas at LOC>, <http://thomas.loc.gov/bss/d107/d107laws.html> for PL 107-347.
2. DOD ST - \$12 Billion annually. Cannot afford to waste it in re-work.
3. DOD Labs / researchers, scientists, and engineers need access to the whole world of information. Government, DOD, academic, commercial, and foreign. We need access to the best – otherwise, how can we defeat the enemy.
4. DTTIS. <http://www.dtic.mil/techtransit/refroom/docs/ar02/e-dtic.pdf> Librarians do not have access to this database. Technology Transfer Offices should have access.
5. Taxonomy – reiterated by many speakers – from Records Management to Homeland Security. The basis for a good organizational website, the basis to good records management, a necessity for sharing information across Departments (i.e. Department of Homeland Security).
6. DTIC IR&D file from Private STINET will use Push technology to distribute quarterly SDI based on user profiles for contractor R&D projects not funded by DOD. This database lists \$3 Billion of proprietary contractor work that might interest government/military researchers. The Push SDI is coming soon.

The 2004 conference had concurrent programs on information trends, training in DTIC systems, new technologies, and information security concerns. There was an excellent session on elicitation.

Three MLD Board members are also on the DTIC User Council: Marybeth Dowdell, Greta Marlatt, and Tracy Landfried.
