LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear SME Foundation Friends,

It was wonderful to see so many of our Foundation supporters at the SME Foundation Annual Gala Dinner during the 2019 SME Annual Conference & Expo in Denver. The Gala was very well attended and provided an opportunity to recognize donor companies and individuals along with scholarship and award winners. Congratulations to all the Foundation Award Winners and our sincere thanks to the valuable Foundation donors!



I want to extend my personal thanks to Bill Hancock for his dedication and service these past two years as the SME Foundation President. Under Bill's leadership, the Foundation has reorganized and repositioned itself to meet the increasing demands of our crucial professional and educational programs. He provided the leadership and drive that were critical to meeting the Foundation financial goals.

In 2017 and 2018 the Foundation has been successful in meeting the challenging fundraising goals of \$1.3-1.6 million. We still have more challenges in front of us with the peak costs of the Ph.D. Fellowship and Career Development Grant Program hitting in 2019 and 2020. These costs and those for the other Foundation professional and educational programs require our fundraising to reach \$1.9 million.

The Foundation Board of Trustees are already busy with efforts from both the Corporate Giving Committee (CGC) and the Individual Fundraising Committee (IFC). Since the SME Annual Conference & Expo, three companies have committed to join the Corporate Roundtable with donations of \$25,000. The IFC is also aggressively targeting some new, exciting events that should be announced later this year.

In addition, last year the SME Foundation and the SME Young Leaders Committee announced a new challenge for SME members under the age of 40. The \$4K by 40 Challenge was developed to encourage philanthropic giving by young SME professionals to promote our industry and the outreach goals of the SME Foundation. Members who contribute \$4,000 or more by the age of 40 will be honored and recognized.

The success of the SME Foundation programs is dependent on the generosity and commitment of our past donors and future donors. Please help the Foundation meet its fundraising goals in order to continue to make an important difference for our industry and our members.
