Today, more than 325,000 miners work in nearly 13,000 mines across the nation to extract minerals from the Earth that play critical roles in the quality of American lives. Everything we depend on is either made from minerals or relies on minerals for its production; from basic living to national defense, communications and transportation, energy and electronics, recreation and agriculture, to the clothes we wear and the cars we drive. According to the [Minerals Education Coalition](#), the average American will need 3.19 million pounds of minerals, metals, and fuels in their lifetime.

They often work in challenging environments so that our lives may be more comfortable,” said SME Executive Director David L.
