



### Background: Philadelphia Region



- Marine facilities on the Delaware River worked over 60,000,000 tons of cargo in 2009.
- The Delaware River handled 2,808 ships in 2010.



#### Background: Philadelphia Regional Port Authority



 A Pennsylvania state agency, PRPA owns seven marine cargo facilities on the Delaware River in Pennsylvania.

 Terminals are leased to private operators. PRPA provides maintenance, marketing, and other services.



#### Port Facilities: PRPA Terminals










- 3.2 million tons of cargo, including 223,000 TEUs, passed through PRPA facilities in 2009.
- In 2010, PRPA facilities worked over 515 merchant ships – an increase of 14% over 2009.





#### Philadelphia Regional Produce Market




- 678,000 square feet facility

# Southport Site Description



- Located in Philadelphia on the Delaware River
- Core footprint consists of approximately 119 acres
- Approximately an additional 120 acres could be made available for development
- Southport site is immediately adjacent to Norfolk Southern intermodal yard at Mustin Field and proximate to CSX Greenwich Yard facility
- Site is within 1 mile (1.6 km) of US interstate highway system – I-95 North/South and I-76 East/West

### The Southport Advantage



- 45 Foot Channel The current Southport design contemplates a 45 ft (13.8 m) channel depth. The first phase of the Deepening Project began in March 2010 and is scheduled for completion by early 2015
- Site Access 3 Class I railroads are located within the vicinity of the
   Southport site and provide access to the US Midwest and eastern Canada
- Ample Air Draft There are no air draft restrictions below 188 ft (57.3 m)
   mean high water (Delaware Memorial Bridge)
- No Assessments There are no equivalent New York Shipping Association assessments for container cargos in Philadelphia, thereby reducing overall cost of transportation
- Trained, Experienced and Flexible Workforce The current International Longshoremen's Association (ILA) contract establishes 19 ILA start times within the Port of Philadelphia, providing significant operational flexibility and time savings
- Productivity and Efficiency The operations at existing Philadelphia
   Regional Port Authority facilities are efficient and productive

# Philadelphia Market



- The Port of Philadelphia is located in the fifth largest metropolitan area in the United States, based on population and total personal income.
- Greater Philadelphia has a population of more than 6.1 million residents, and total employment of 2.9 million jobs.
- 100 million people live within one day's drive of the Port.
- Greater Philadelphia is the fourth largest retail market in the U.S. and had the seventh largest gross metropolitan product in 2009.
- The Port of Philadelphia is less than two hours by truck from the New York metropolitan market and less than 3 hours from the Washington DC market.







# Southport Development Team



- In October of 2010 it was announced that Delaware River Stevedores (DRS) along with the consortium of Ports America Group, Carrix, and Hyundai Merchant Marine were the bidders chosen by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to develop and operate the Southport Marine Terminal
- DRS brings with it significant local experience and a strong working relationship with the ILA locals
- Ports America Group and Carrix bring operating experience and development capacity to the project
- Hyundai Merchant Marine, as a key member of the New World Alliance (NWA) shipping line consortium, brings a worldwide cargo network and the ability to provide anchor cargo volumes









### **Key Development Dates**



- November 2010 June 2013 Pre-Construction Period
   All permitting, demolition of abandoned Naval housing, project design, financing, and potential construction of an access road into the project site will be completed
- June 2013 March 2016 Site Prep and Dredge Work
- March 2016 March 2017 Phase I Construction Phase I will consist of one berth, three gantry cranes, and approximately 70 acres of container yard. The primary mode of container movement in this phase will be top-pick and bomb carts, however the yard will be constructed to accommodate RMGs or RTGs in the future. Estimated throughput of Phase I would be approximately 400,000 TEU annually.
- March 2017 March 2019 Phase II Construction
  This phase will add a second berth, approximately 20 acres of container yard, and three additional gantry cranes. Upon completion of Phase II, throughput at the terminal is expected to be approximately 800,000 TEU annually.
- March 2019 March 2020 Phase III Construction Phase III would add approximately 30 acres of container yard. Upon completion of Phase III estimated throughput at the terminal would be 1,000,000 TEU annually.
