Minister McHugh to join SPE Global President at inaugural Irish Section event

Massive demand sees event fully booked

The Inaugural lecture of the Irish Section of the SPE, will be addressed by the Global SPE President and the Minister of State at the Department of Communications Energy and Natural Resources, Joe McHugh.

The event is taking place in the Westin Hotel in Dublin City Centre. The lecture which begins at 7pm will be preceded by a drinks reception from 6.15pm.

Also speaking at the event will be, Tony O'Reilly jnr, CEO of Providence Resources and Paul Markwell, VP of IHS.

Demand for the event has been extremely high and a waiting list is now in place for the fully booked out event. Admission on the evening is by ticket only.

The visit to Dublin will be one of the first official engagements for the newly appointed SPE President. During his stay in Ireland he will meet with Minister McHugh, address a function for SPE student members and visit the offices of Tullow Oil and Providence Resources.

The Inaugural event is being kindly sponsored by **IHS**. SPE Ireland are very grateful to them for their support.

SPE Distinguished Lecture Series 2015

The Distinguished Lecturer Series is an important element of SPE's work around the world. Distinguished Lectures offer members an opportunity to gain insights from experienced industry professionals in a range of key disciplines.

Ireland will host three lectures in the series in 2015.

The first of these will take place on 18th February 2015 at 6pm. The lecturer will be Dr. James Crofton a former Chief Reservoir Engineer at the Panhandle Eastern Pipeline Company. He will deliver a lecture entitled *"US Shale Well Performance Metrics – We Shale Succeed."*

The second lecture will take place on May 20th, with Terry Matthias speaking on the topic; *"Diamond – A Drillers Best Friend."*

The final lecture of the year will be confirmed later in 2015.

2014 Review

2014 was a significant year for Irish SPE members as the Ireland Section of SPE was established. The initiative was instigated by Carlos Chalbaud (SPE Director – North Sea) who contacted members in the region in October 2013 to gauge interest in the establishment of such a section. After initial responses, he arranged to come to Dublin in March 2014 to meet with Irish members who wished to become involved. After a positive and enthusiastic meeting, the group decided to push forward and investigate the potential of an Ireland Section. At that juncture there were around 50 SPE members with Irish addresses who were attached mainly to the London and Aberdeen sections. A second meeting of this provisional Ireland Section board was held in June 2014 where it was decided that the proposed new section was viable.

Things happened very quickly thereafter. Having secured the prerequisite 25 members, the new section was formally established in August 2014. The new board came together in that month and elected Jeremy Gilbert as the first Chairman and went quickly about the task of growing membership (growing the membership to 90 members within the first 3 months) and planning some events; notably an informal “Meet the Board” event in Dublin which took place in November 2014 and the upcoming SPE Ireland Inaugural Event – **“Irish Offshore Exploration & Production: The Future is Now”** which will take place in Dublin on January 28th 2014. In addition to this activity, an SPE Student Chapter was established in UCD, with other 3rd level Student Chapters in the offing.

And, looking ahead, 2015 looks like being an equally active year, with two Distinguished Lecturer events organised for the first half of the year and more to come.

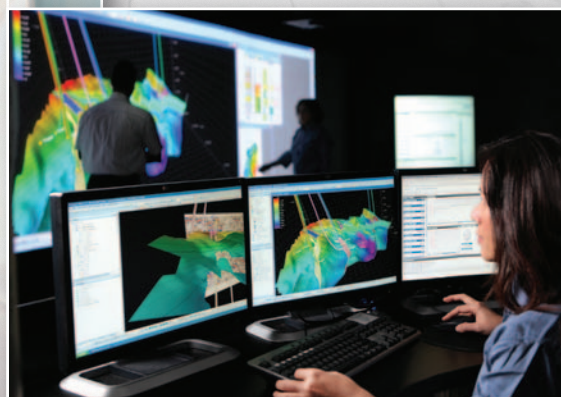
