New Government regulations based on the Nigerian Oil and Gas Industry Content Development Bill of 2010 stipulates that for all works and contract to be undertaken in or on behalf of all companies operating in the Nigerian oil and gas industry, certain stipulated number of Nigerian Content must be achieved. To this end a number of processes have been put in place to ensure the success of this goal, including a contract evaluation and award criteria which favours bids that meet or exceed minimum local content target, as well as level a list of work categories that must be executed. This session would address the challenges facing Nigeria effective implementation of this policy as well evaluate the progress made so far.

Bridging the Gap. Taking up leadership roles in the oil and gas industry

Presenter: Cletus Egbuzie - GM OTSS, ExxonMobil

The global oil and gas industry today is besieged by numerous challenges that cut across national boundaries and region. These include a number of factors including changing geopolitical relationships, dynamics of demand and supply, demographic shifts, environmental and social pressures as well as the emergence of new competitors and competition. However, one challenge stands out among the pack. The need to meet global demand for energy which is increasing dramatically, driven in large part by population growth and the strong desire of developing countries to achieve economic prosperity.

This lecture seeks to discuss the "why" and the "how" in empowering young professionals to address these challenges as it affects the oil and gas industry, especially in Nigeria.

The speaker is currently the General Manager of Operations Technical Subsurface in Exxon Mobil, where he has the functional oversight of the Reservoir Engineering and Subsurface (Completion) Engineering Departments. He brings over 30 years of experience in leading and managing personnel and the use of technology is well operations and reservoir engineering.

Cletus earned his first degree with Honors in Natural Gas Engineering from Texas A&M University and a Master Degree in Petroleum Engineering from the University of Oklahoma. Until his current position, he has held various technical and managerial positions in Nigeria and Texas.
