Lagos holds 2014 power kids programme

The Lagos Power Kids Programme (LAPK), an energy initiative of the state government being implemented by the Lagos State Electricity Board (LSEB) in collaboration with the Eko Project and Society of Petroleum Engineers, will kick off Wednesday January 29, 2014.

The initiative which started in 2011, with 30 participating schools, forms part of the state's energy development plan aimed at improving energy efficiency and conservation practice amongst the citizens.

Governor Babatunde Raji Fashola had at the 2013 Governor's Education Awards extended the number of participating schools from 30 to 50 for the 2014 edition of the programme. This year, 20 students have been selected from each of the 50 schools on merit, taking the number of participating students to 1,000.

In the 2014 LAPK, the students will be tutored on energy and electricity, energy conservation and efficiency, dangers of electricity and simple circuit experiment, sources of energy, solar energy as well as oil and gas.

In addition, the students will be visiting the LSEB office solar farm as well as the recently commissioned Alausa independent power plant (IPP) which supplies power to the state secretariat, Alausa, Ikeja.

Damilola Ogunbiyi, the general manager of LSEB, said the objectives of the annual event is to improve the knowledge of the students about energy sources, the power sector and inculcate a habit of energy conservation from an early
