### **Structure**

- Two internship cohorts

- Interns are each assigned a manager
- Interns work 24-32 hours a week and 1-2/week days in office



## Management

- Interns have a wide range of experience and abilities to work independently.
- First time in working world for many of them
- Interns are supervised closely by their managers and mentors
  - Interns meet as a group once a week
  - Interns meet 1:1 with their manager 1-2 times a week.



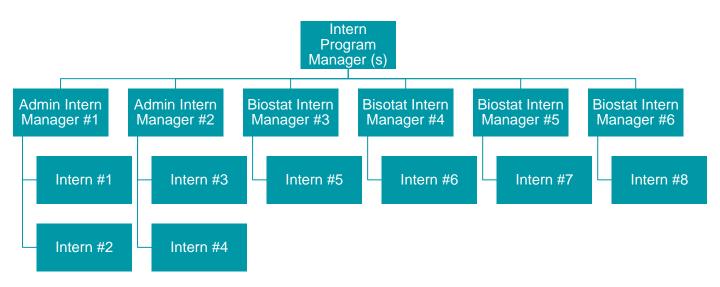
# Mentor Vs. Manager

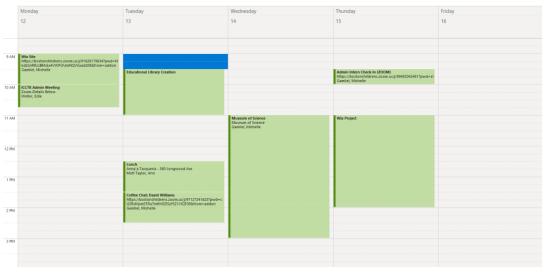

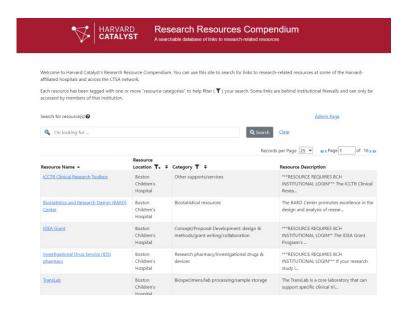

TITRE is a multicenter trial being conducted in the United States and Canada. The goal of TITRE is to determine whether restricting blood transfusion results in less organ impairment and improves long term outcomes for children who receive ECMO support.

#### About ECMO & Blood **Transfusion**

Extracorporeal Membrane Oxygenation (ECMO) is used for heart and lung support. When children are supported on ECMO, they receive a lot of blood transfusions. These are to manage bleeding, and to provide hemoglobin, which is important for carrying oxygen to tissues. Experts believe there may be benefit to using blood transfusions only when there are signs that there is not enough oxygen being delivered to tissues, rather than to target a predefined hemoglobin level. In this study, these two different strategies for decision-making around blood transfusion will be studied to see if either strategy is better to prevent organ dysfunction and improve later functional and development outcomes.

Currently, the optimal strategy for blood transfusion in ECMO patients is unknown.

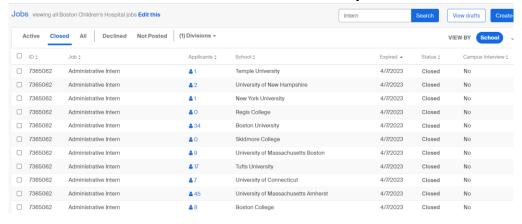

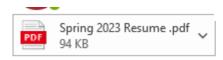


### **Professional Networking for Recruitment**

### **Interview Process**

- Collated resumes from different sources:
  - Handshake (120), BCH Website (80), and referrals
- Review resumes
- Met with greater team to determine top candidates to interview
- Schedule interviews
  - Created interview scoring rubric
  - Interviewed all interns
  - Scored all interns
- Bring top candidates back for "last interviews" with senior leadership

# **Interviewing Results**

- 16 people interviewed
- 4 offers made 3
   accepted

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# **Outcome/Results**

- Summer 2022 intern was hired to work both fall and spring semesters and as of May 2023 was a full-time employee
- 2 summer 2023 interns were offered full year internship positions at Boston Children's Hospital.
- Other interns now working in research administration
- Directors from other departments want to implement internship programs.



### Impact on Interns

My internship at Boston Children's Hospital was the best experience I have had as a student. The internship allowed me to explore the field of healthcare administration to determine if this was the career I wanted to pursue. After learning several different things and meeting numerous individuals across the hospital, I confirmed my interest in working in this field.
