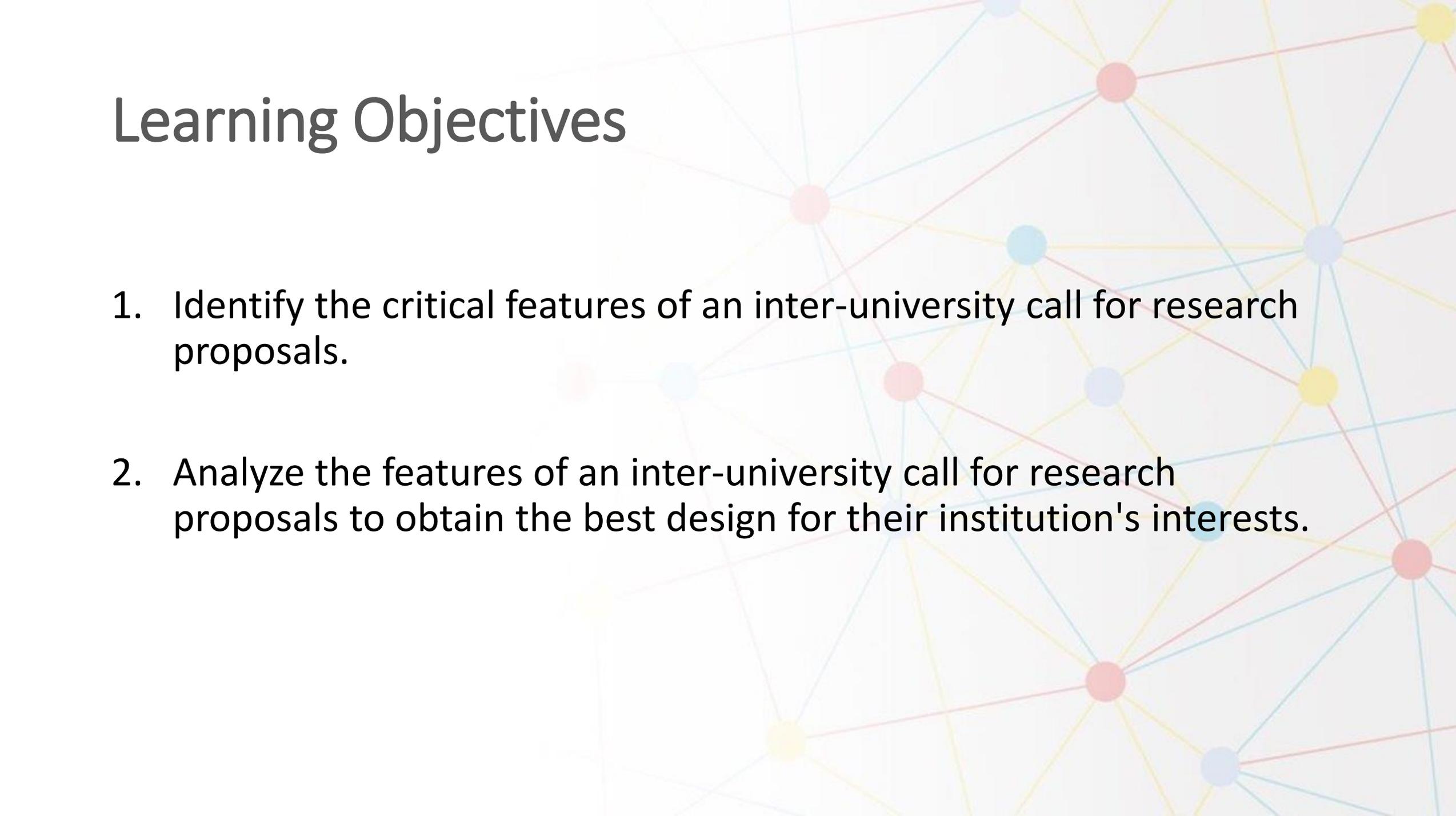

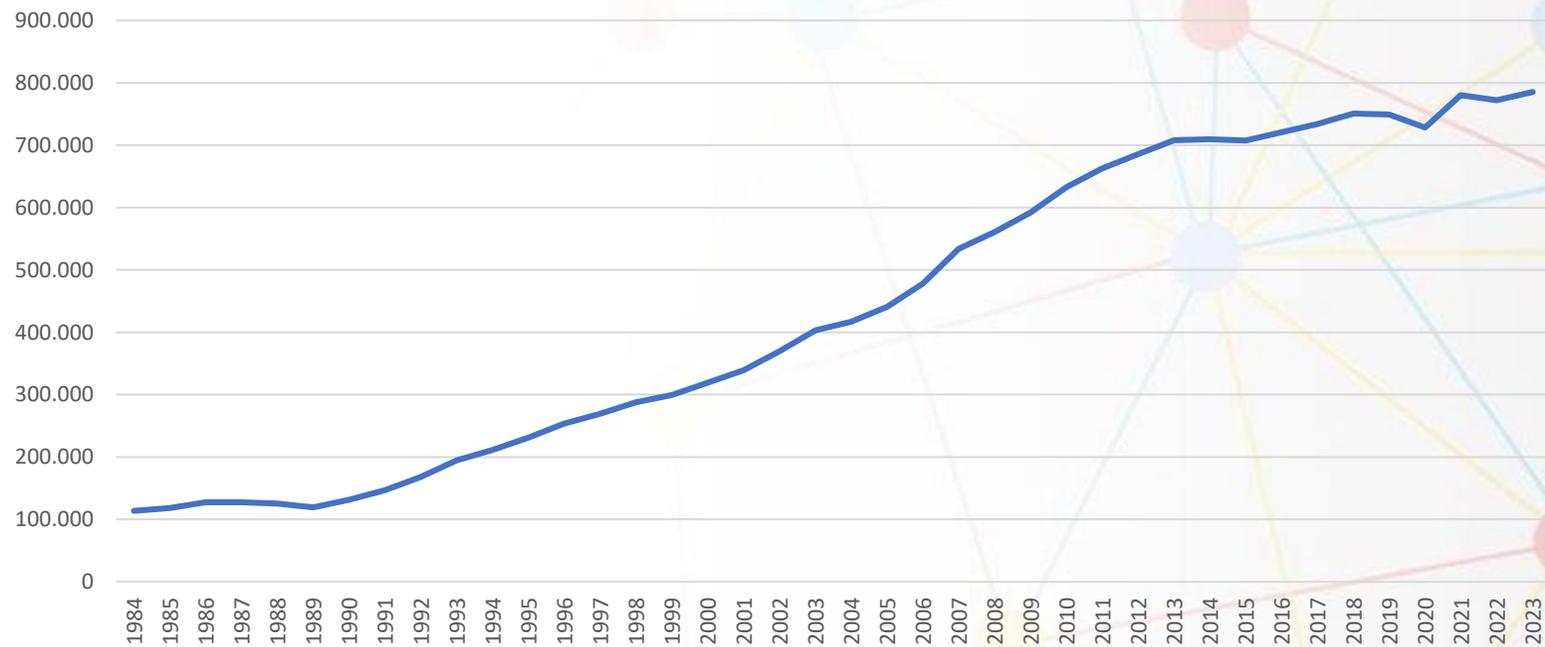

Background Chilean University System

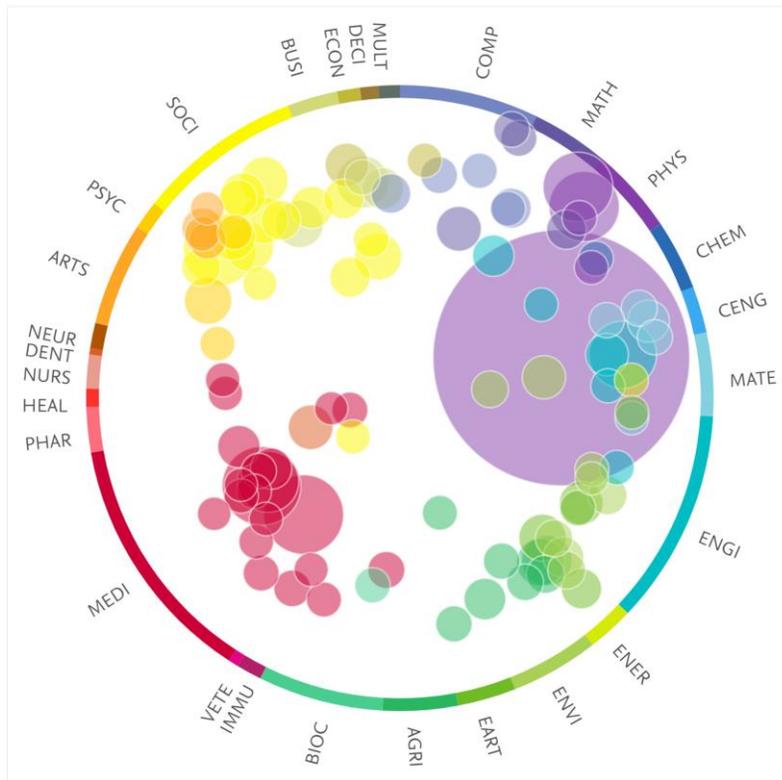
Almost 50% of the students enrolled in a university by 2023 are studying in a private university founded less than 40 years ago.

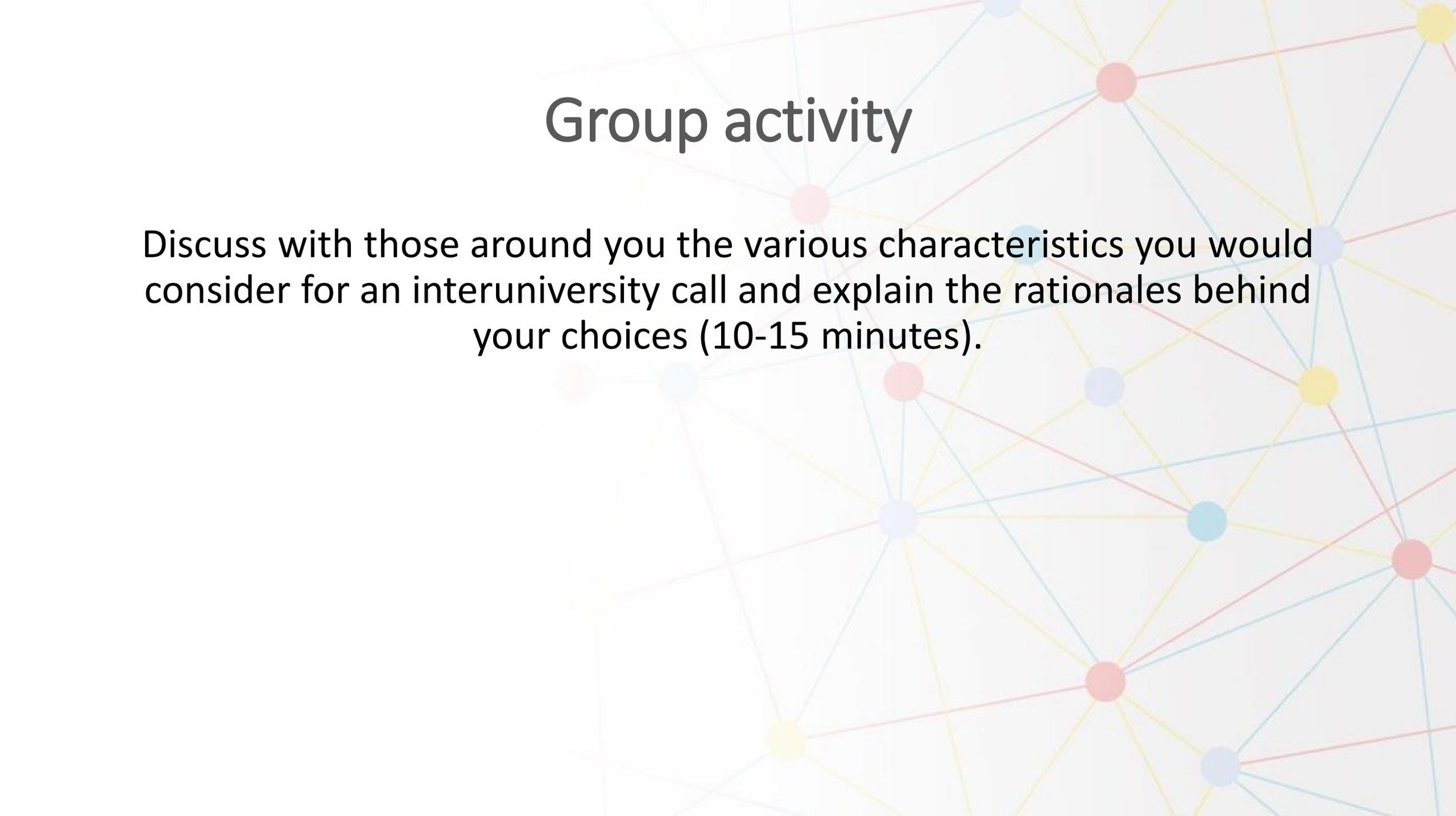

Our Experience



Brief History

In early 2022, during the first in-person meeting post-pandemic, the General Directorates of Research (DGI) analyzed collaboration among the universities within the group and their potential areas of synergy (publications, centers, and scientific-technological equipment).

Based on the diagnosis obtained, the DGIs decided to propose to their universities the possibility of launching a call for a collaborative research initiation competition. After approval, the call was launched in September 2022, receiving 49 applications, which were later evaluated, leading to a decision meeting in April 2023, where 11 proposals were awarded.

Instrument

- Seed fund aimed at collaborative research for young researchers.
- Cumulative benefits for each university's participation.
- Requires student involvement.
- Requires signing the Singapore Declaration.
- Involves dissemination and outreach efforts.
- Sets specific conditions for each university.

Results

- 49 proposals with 123 participations
- 11 funded projects with 28 participations
 - 6 projects to be developed fully or partially outside the Metropolitan Region
 - 7 projects → 2 U's, 2 projects → 3 U's, 2 projects → 4 U's
 - 15 male directors and 13 female directors
 - +/- USD 150.000

Learnings & Challenges

Learnings

- Starting from a first draft (even if it has flaws) is highly preferable to starting from scratch
- There are many tasks to be done; choose some and proceed
- Joint development will take much longer - in everything - than doing it alone
- The new leadership will require a deep and systematic induction from the original leadership

“if you want to go fast, go alone; if you want to go far, go together”

Challenges

- How to position the initiative beyond the original leadership
- How to maintain the interest of all participating universities and manage the renewal
- 2nd Edition was launched in September 2023
