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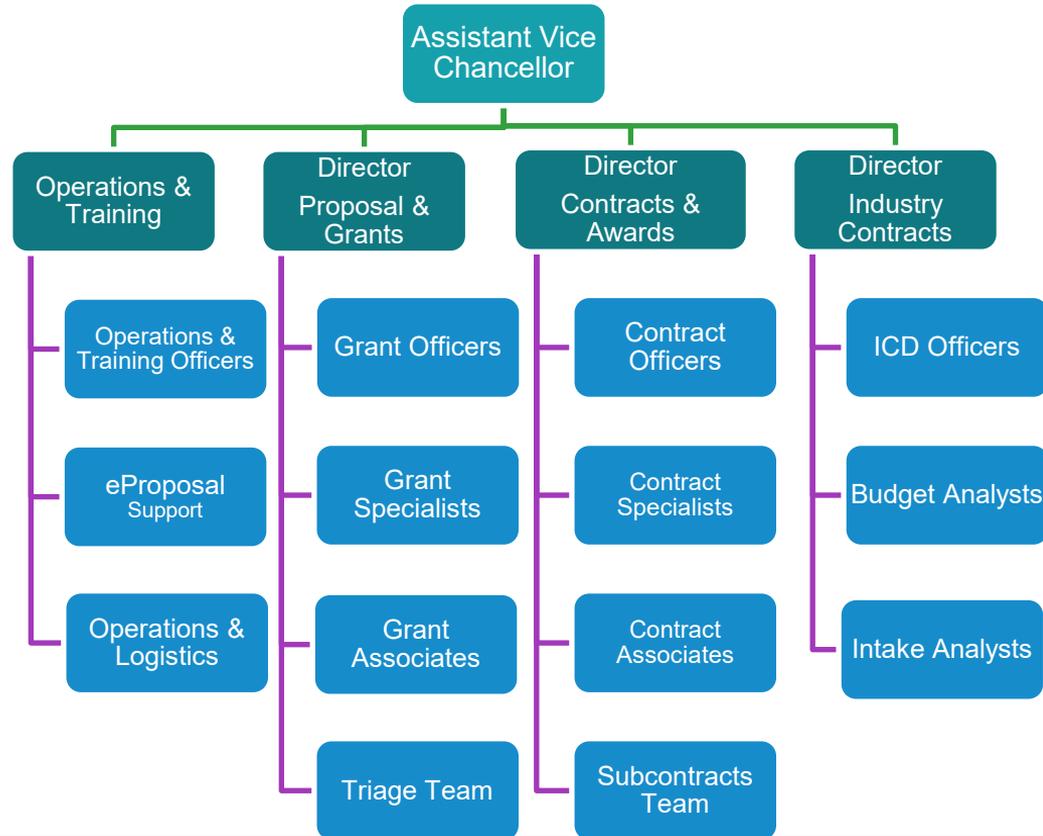

# Staff Council: Origin Story



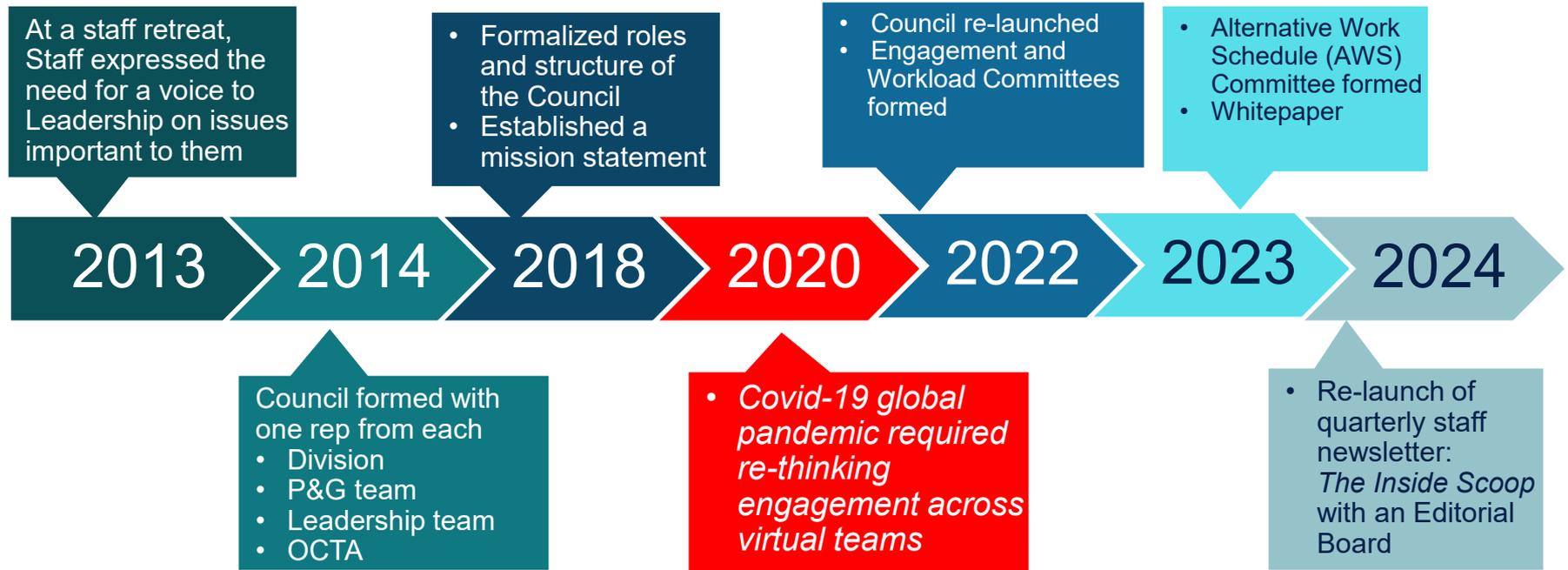

# How Does Council Work?

- Representatives from All Teams
- Members serve as liaisons to their team
  - Bring issues/questions, provide updates on initiatives
- Subcommittees Form via Motion from any member
  - Members volunteer for subcommittees



# Staff Council: Technical Projects



# Technical Projects

## ***Brown Bag/Cross-Training Sessions***

- What are they?
  - Monthly Introductory Sessions to teams across campus
  - Lunch-Time brownbag sessions to learn more about each other
  - In our third year!
- What's Working
  - High attendance (60-80% of department)
  - Positive feedback based on surveys
  - Increased engagement, relationship-building and sharing of knowledge/resources



# Technical Projects

## *Brown Bag/Cross-Training Sessions*

### ■ What's Not?

- Repeat sessions are not practical for newer staff
- Time constraints do not allow for in-depth discussion
- Delays in launching Phase II of cross-training program
- Topics may not be relevant to all staff

### ■ Takeaways

- Cross-training doesn't always need to be formal!
- With remote work, putting faces to names is extremely valuable
- Research Administration is so multi-faceted, it's important to introduce staff to various stakeholders within the research lifecycle



# Technical Projects

## *Service Partnership Agreement (SPA)*

### ■ What is it?

- Formal agreement between Office of Sponsored Research and Campus
- Outlines services provided by OSR and standard timelines for transactions
- Provides roles and responsibilities for department, central office, and PI
- Covers all types of transactions, proposals, awards, subawards, etc.

### ■ What's Working

- Sets expectations for PIs and departments on service delivery from OSR
- Sets clear expectations for timelines and deadlines
- Provides clarity on who does what within OSR



# Technical Projects

## *Service Partnership Agreement (SPA)*

### ■ What's Not?

- Not all departments are aware of the SPA
- Education, Training & Outreach are still needed in conjunction with the SPA
- Requires dedicated effort to maintain, leadership buy-in, needs updating more frequently than once every 10 years

### ■ Takeaways

- Overall, it's been helpful to have a document OSR can refer to when questions arise about service delivery
- Requires significant effort from campus stakeholders to develop and maintain



# Technical Projects

## *White Paper on Workload*

### ■ What is It?

- In 2023, subcommittee formed to evaluate workload, burnout, and request information from OSR leadership
- Goal was to determine benchmark data for workload distribution, job-creep, and equity between teams within OSR
- White Paper was delivered to OSR Executive Leadership in 2023

### ■ What's Working?

- OSR Executive Leadership has launched a workload evaluation project to begin to address issues with burnout, equitable workload distribution, and potential understaffing
- Subcommittee on Alternative Work Arrangement was launched in early 2024



# Technical Projects

## *White Paper on Workload*

### ■ What's Not?

- With a large OSR, this evaluation is a large undertaking and is taking a long time
- Issues such as complexity, consistency between teams, tracking non-transactional job duties complicate evaluation of workload
- UCSF doesn't currently have a workload management tool, and the evaluation process will include anecdotal and observational data vs. empirical data

### ■ Takeaways

- The White Paper encouraged Leadership to take a closer look at burnout, equity in workload distribution, and employee morale
- Evaluating workload in Research Administration is no easy task! Issues such as complexity, non-transactional tasks, difficult PIs may need further analysis
- Additional flexibility with work schedules may offer one way to reduce staff burnout, but more research is needed

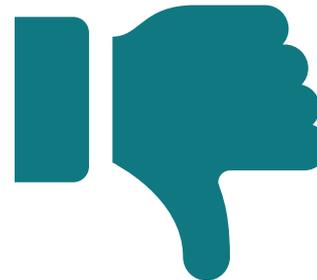
# Engagement Committee

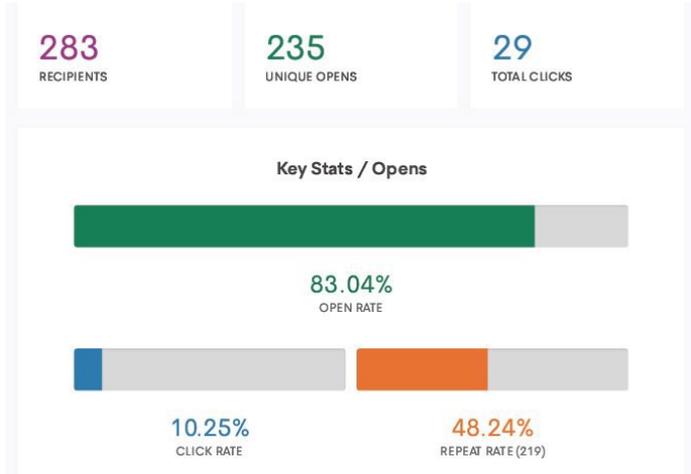
