

Overall Document

- Editorial changes have been made throughout to either clarify or enhance the intended meaning of a sentence or section.
- Website and document references have been updated to reflect current information.
- Updates have been made to ensure consistency with data contained in NSF systems or guidance located and terminology used in other NSF or Federal policy documents.

By-Chapter Changes

Chapter I: Pre-Submission Information

- **Chapter I.D, Concept Outlines**, has been updated to provide additional clarity on the use of concept outlines and the Program Suitability and Proposal Concept Tool (ProSPCT).
- **Chapter I.D, Types of Submissions**, includes new coverage on the use of concept outlines and the required use of the Program Suitability and Proposal Concept Tool (ProSPCT) for submission. Additional changes on the use of concept outlines and the use of ProSPCT for specific proposal types is available in Chapter II.E.
- **Chapter I.E, Who May Submit Proposals:**



PAPPG (NSF 24-1) – Highlighted Topics

- Malign Foreign Talent Recruitment Programs (MFTRP)
 - Any individual who is a current party to a MFTRP is ineligible to serve as a senior/key person on an NSF proposal or award.
 - This requirement applies to any proposal submitted or due on or after May 20, 2024.
 - Definition of MFTRP is contained in the PAPPG Introduction, Section D.
 - Each senior/key person must certify prior to proposal submission that they are not a party to a MFTRP (Biographical Sketch and Current and Pending (Other) Support).
 - Each PI and co-PI on any NSF award must certify annually thereafter.
 - A new term and condition has been added implementing this requirement post-award.
 - Organizations must certify upon proposal submission that all senior/key personnel have been made aware of and complied with the requirement that they are not a party to a MFTRP.



PAPPG (NSF 24-1) – Highlighted Topics

- Postaward Foreign Financial Disclosure Report (FFDR) requirements (applies to each IHE that receives an award or funding amendment on an existing award made on or after May 20, 2024)
 - Section 10339B of CHIPS and Science Act of 2022:
 - In accordance with Section 10339B, *Foreign Financial Support*, of the CHIPS and Science Act of 2022, (42 U.S.C. § 19040), each "recipient institution of higher education" must annually report all "current financial support, the value of which is \$50,000 or more, including gifts and contracts, **received directly or indirectly from a foreign source**" which is "associated with a foreign country of concern," as defined in the PAPPG Introduction, Section D.



PAPPG (NSF 24-1) – Highlighted Topics

- Foreign Financial Disclosure Report
 - Each IHE that receives **direct NSF funding** must submit an institutional report annually – negative reports are required.
 - Reporting includes any gift or contract with a cumulative value of \$50K or more per source from a country of concern.
 - Reports must be submitted by July 31 each calendar year in Research.gov.
 - IHEs must maintain copies of relevant records.
 - NSF may request copies of contracts, agreements, or documentation of financial transactions associated with disclosures.
 - Organizations other than IHEs are not required to submit annual FFDR reports.
 - A new term and condition has been added implementing this requirement post-award.



FFDR Portal Key Takeaways

- All FFDR Preparers in the same IHE can create a report in Research.gov, edit an existing report, or submit a report created by another FFDR preparer.
- Only one FFDR can be submitted in Research.gov per IHE.
- Every IHE organization must submit a negative or positive report in Research.gov.
- Foreign support received between July 1, 2024, and June 30, 2025, will report in the Year 2 submission window which begins on July 1, 2025.
- Once a report is submitted to NSF in Research.gov, it cannot be deleted or withdrawn.
- FFDR is specific to financial support received from a foreign country of concern (i.e., China, North Korea, Russian, and Iran).
- If the cumulative value of all gifts and contracts received from a foreign source does not equal or exceed \$50,000, then it is not required to report them in Research.gov.



FFDR Future Plans

- Monitor feedback from the research community.
 - NSF thanks the community for your feedback to date!!
- Consider adjusting reporting due dates for future years.
- Add “copy” feature to reduce administrative burden for Year 2 and subsequent year reports.
- Consider adding capability to download submitted reports.
- Enhance post-submission processes (i.e., amendment and extension requests).
- Enhance FFDR functionality based on future PAPPG requirements.

- Mentoring plan requirement expanded to include graduate students
- Biographical Sketch
- Synergistic Activities
- Current and Pending (Other) Support
- Proposals that may impact tribal resources or interests



Revising 2 CFR - Background

- The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) directed agencies to incorporate 2 CFR revisions by October 1, 2024
- The Council on Federal Financial Assistance (COFFA) has included the revisions and associated documents on its website

NSF Implementation of the Revised 2 CFR

- OMB directed agencies to implement the revisions to 2 CFR for awards made on or after October 1, 2024.
- NSF implements 2 CFR in two ways:
 - *NSF Proposal and Award Policies and Procedures Guide (PAPPG)*
 - *Award Terms and Conditions*
- NSF has revised the *Grant General Conditions (GC-1)* for awards made on or after October 1st.
- The *Research Terms and Conditions (RTC)* will no longer be referenced in awards made on or after October 1, 2024.
 - The RTC page will remain available for prior awards that are subject to the RTCs.

- Cooperative Agreement Modifications and Supplemental Financial and Administrative Terms and Conditions for Major Multi-User Research Facility Projects and Federally Funded Research and Development Centers
- Cooperative Agreement Modifications and Supplemental Financial and Administrative Terms and Conditions for Mid-Scale Research Infrastructure Projects
- Special Terms and Conditions for Administration of NSF Conference or Travel Grants (FL 26)
- Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR)/Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) Terms and Conditions
- International Research Terms and Conditions (IRTC)
- Special Terms and Conditions for Administration of NSF Conference or Travel Awards Made to International Organizations (FL 26 for IRTC)



Revision of 2 CFR – NSF Implementation Process

- Unless otherwise specified, the *Grant General Conditions* (GC-1) will apply to all recipients of NSF grant awards, including:
 - Institutions of Higher Education (IHEs);
 - Non-profit, non-academic organizations;
 - For-profit organizations (other than Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR)/Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) recipients);
 - State and local governments; and
 - Tribal Nations.
- In the case of any inconsistency between the coverage contained in the NSF *Proposal and Award Policies and Procedures Guide* and 2 CFR (including 2 CFR part 200), the coverage specified in 2 CFR applies.



Revision of 2 CFR – NSF Implementation Process

- The following statement appears on NSF program pages:

NSF Financial Assistance awards (grants and cooperative agreements) made on or after October 1, 2024, will be subject to the applicable set of award conditions, dated October 1, 2024, available on the NSF website. These terms and conditions are consistent with the revised guidance specified in the OMB Guidance for Federal Financial Assistance published in the Federal Register on April 22, 2024.
- The following appears as a header in each PAPPG (NSF 24-1) Chapter:

In the case of any inconsistency between the coverage contained in the *NSF Proposal and Award Policies and Procedures Guide* and 2 CFR (including 2 CFR part 200), the coverage specified in 2 CFR applies.

Summary of Changes

Overall Document

- Editorial changes have been made to either clarify or enhance the intended meaning of a sentence or section.
- Website references have been updated to reflect current information.
- Updates have been made to ensure consistency with terminology contained in 2 CFR.
- The term "article" has been changed to "term and condition" throughout for consistency with Government-wide terminology.
- Numbering has been updated as a result of the reordering of certain terms and conditions.

Changes to Individual Terms and Conditions

- **Recipient Responsibilities and Federal Requirements, Term and Condition Number (No.) 1.** This term and condition has been clarified to note that unless otherwise specified, GC-1 applies to all recipient types.

The term and condition also has been updated to cross-reference Term and Condition No. 14 for recipient responsibilities to notify NSF when a significant development that could impact the award occurs between project reporting dates.

The *National Policy Requirements Matrix* has been revised to solely list those requirements that are applicable to NSF grants and has been renamed *National Policy Requirements for Recipients of NSF Awards*.
- **Prior Approval Requirements, Term and Condition No. 2.** The previous Project Changes term and condition text has been revised to consolidate the prior approval requirements into the same location in the document. Specific information on flow down provisions has been removed, given that the recipient is responsible for addressing the relevant requirements in subaward instruments.

The *Prior Approval Matrix* has been updated for consistency with the revised 2 CFR part 200. The document also has been revised to solely list those requirements that are applicable to NSF grants and has been renamed the *NSF Prior Approval Matrix*.
- **Participant Support Costs, Term and Condition No. 3.** This term and condition has been moved up to sequentially provide prior approval coverage in order. The term and condition also has been updated to incorporate the revised definition of participant support costs specified in 2 CFR § 200.1.
- **Rearrangement and Reconversion Costs, Term and Condition No. 4.** This term and condition has been moved up to sequentially provide prior approval coverage in order. The reference to Appendix II of 2 CFR part 200 has been relocated to Term and Condition No. 2.

Summary of Changes Made to the GC-1

Recipient Responsibilities and Federal Requirements

- Clarified to note that unless otherwise specified, GC-1 applies to all recipient types.
- Updated to cross-reference recipient responsibilities to notify NSF when a significant development that could impact the award occurs between project reporting dates.

Prior Approval Requirements

- Specific information on flow down provisions has been removed, given that the recipient is responsible for addressing the relevant requirements in subaward instruments.
 - GC-1 also has been revised to consolidate the prior approval requirements in one location in the document.

Participant Support Costs

- Updated to incorporate the revised definition of participant support costs specified in 2 CFR § 200.1.



Summary of Changes Made to the GC-1

Equipment

- Revised to specify that, unless specifically identified in the award as exempt property, title to equipment purchased or fabricated under the award conditionally vests upon acquisition in the recipient for consistency with 2 CFR § 200.313(a).
- Unless NSF provides alternative disposition instructions no later than 120 days after the end date of the NSF-supported project for which it was acquired, NSF grants unconditional title to equipment in the recipient or subrecipient.
- NSF reserves the right to transfer the title to the Federal Government or a third party named by the Federal Government at any time during the award period or in disposition instructions issued no later than 120 days after the end date of the NSF-supported project for which it was acquired.
- The required inventory information for Federally-owned property has been updated for consistency with 2 CFR § 200.313.



Summary of Changes Made to the GC-1

Allowable Costs

- Expanded to include references to the cost principles that are applicable to IHEs and non-profit, non-academic organizations.

Payments

- Recipient requests for payment updated to emphasize the requirements in 2 CFR § 200.305 regarding timing of payments

Project Reporting Requirements

- Language included that addresses significant developments that occur between project reporting due dates.
- The OMB-designated integrity and performance system has changed from Federal Awardee Performance and Integrity Information System to SAM.gov.

Responsible and Ethical Conduct of Research

- Incorporated into GC-1 and only applies to IHEs.



Summary of Changes Made to the GC-1

Reporting Subawards and Executive Compensation

- Incorporates the revised award term from Appendix A to Part 170.

System for Award Management (SAM.gov) and Universal Identifier Requirements

- Incorporates the revised award term from Appendix A to Part 25.

Academic Technology Transfer and Commercialization of University Research

- Incorporated into GC-1 and only applies to IHEs.

Copyrighted Material

- The term “nontransferable” has been deleted and the royalty-free license rights language has been updated for consistency with the revised 2 CFR part 200.



Summary of Changes Made to the GC-1

Program Income

- Full definition of program income from 2 CFR § 200.1 has been incorporated for greater transparency.

Intangible Property

- Links to the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) Bayh-Dole Regulations for Federal Funding Inventions and the current Interagency Domestic Manufacturing Waiver Form have been added to this term and condition.

Audit and Records

- Language has been added from 2 CFR § 200.337 regarding right of access to records of the recipient and subrecipient pertinent to the Federal award.

Termination and Enforcement

- Updated for consistency with the suspension and termination requirements contained in the revised 2 CFR part 200.



Summary of Changes Made to the GC-1

Whistleblower Protection

- Information on the overall requirements and applicability of 41 U.S.C. § 4712 has been incorporated for greater transparency.

Build America, Buy America

- Updated for consistency with 2 CFR part 184.

Foreign Financial Disclosure Report (FFDR) (CHIPS and Science Act of 2022)

- Incorporated into GC-1 and applies only to IHEs.

Resolution of Conflicting Conditions

- Updated to indicate if GC-1 is silent on a specific area covered by 2 CFR (including 2 CFR part 200), 2 CFR applies.
- A new provision also has been added indicating the order of precedence should there be an inconsistency between 2 CFR (including 2 CFR part 200) and the NSF *Proposal and Award Policies and Procedures Guide* (PAPPG).



Summary of Changes Made to the GC-1

- Revised to solely list those requirements that are applicable to NSF grants and has been renamed *National Policy Requirements for Recipients of NSF Awards*.

Prior Approval Matrix

- Updated for consistency with the revised 2 CFR part 200.
- Revised to solely list those requirements that are applicable to NSF grants and has been renamed the *NSF Prior Approval Matrix*.

2 CFR 200 – Indirect Costs: NSF Proposals and Awards

- Negotiated Indirect Cost Rate Agreements (NICRAs) negotiated prior to October 1, 2024, must continue to be honored by both Federal agencies and recipients.
- Recipients can ask their cognizant agency for indirect costs to immediately revise/reissue their rate with the new base, but this will be on a limited case-by-case basis. Otherwise, bases will be updated during the next rate negotiation.

2 CFR 200 – *De Minimis*: NSF Proposals and Awards

- Unless otherwise noted in a program solicitation, recipients may elect to use the new 15 percent *de minimis* indirect cost rate for any new award executed on or after October 1, 2024.
- Unless otherwise noted by the program solicitation/award notice, recipients may apply the 15 percent *de minimis* rate to existing awards, provided that there are sufficient funds to do so and still adequately meet stated project objectives.
- The 15 percent *de minimis* rate may only be charged to costs incurred on or after October 1, 2024; recipients may not retroactively apply the *de minimis* rate to costs incurred prior to this date.
- *De minimis* rate is applied to the new base on October 1, 2024.



Simplification of NSF Funding Opportunities

- OMB published guidance directing agencies to simplify funding opportunities (M-24-11, *Reducing Burden in the Administration of Federal Financial Assistance*).
- In accordance with revised 2 CFR part 200, agencies are directed to make funding opportunities as clear and concise as possible, limit length, complexity and increase accessibility to proposers, especially organizations with limited resources and underserved communities.
- An updated funding opportunity template also is included as Appendix I to 2 CFR part 200.
- NSF has conducted listening sessions with the Federal Demonstration Partnership to obtain feedback on Foundation funding opportunities.



Simplification of NSF Funding Opportunities

- NSF has convened two Foundation-wide working groups to consider the most impactful changes to achieve the desired simplification and streamlining results:
 - Working group No. 1 is considering the streamlining of the NSF solicitation; and
 - Working group No. 2 is considering the content of the NSF research proposal.
- NSF is taking steps to simplify program solicitations by:
 - Removing sections that are not required as part of the revised 2 CFR 200 template;
 - Deleting redundant sections that appear multiple times in a funding opportunity;
 - Removing or reducing the length of standard boilerplate text;
 - Including direct links to guidance in the PAPPG rather than repeating text;
 - Implementing plain language guidance and/or word count restrictions for certain sections; and
 - Establishing internal guidance and best practices for NSF program staff on the development of the program description section of solicitations.



Upcoming PAPPG Timeline

- The content of the next PAPPG is currently being finalized.
 - Next step will be clearance through NSF senior leadership.
- NSF will continue to provide the 60-day public comment period.
- Anticipated effective date, October 2025.



Multifactor Authentication for Research.gov Sign-in

- Effective Oct. 27, 2024, NSF implemented mandatory multifactor authentication (MFA) for Research.gov sign-in
- MFA is a layered security measure that requires two or more authentication methods to verify a user's identity
- MFA protects both research community users and NSF
- Users with administrative or financial roles signing into Research.gov with NSF credentials must use a phishing-resistant MFA
- All users must use MFA each time they sign into Research.gov on or after Oct. 27


