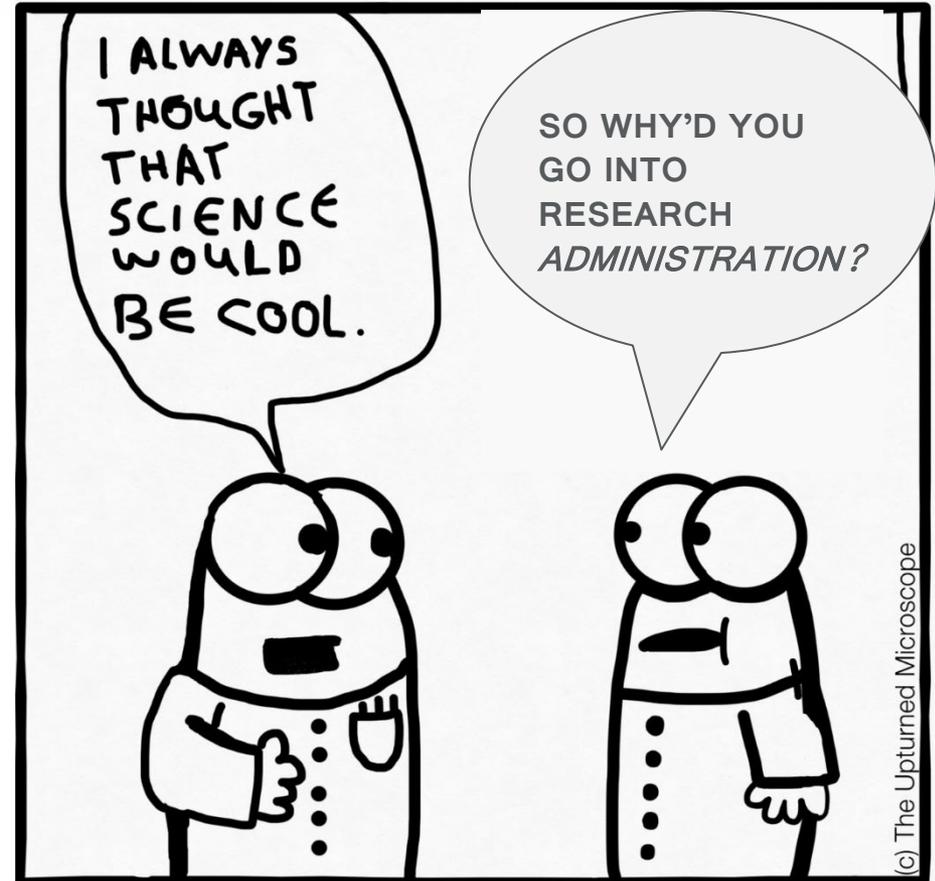

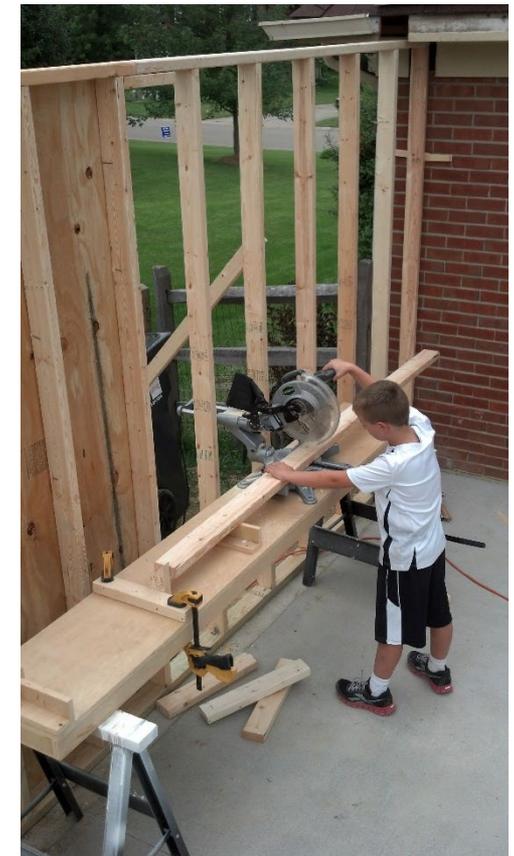

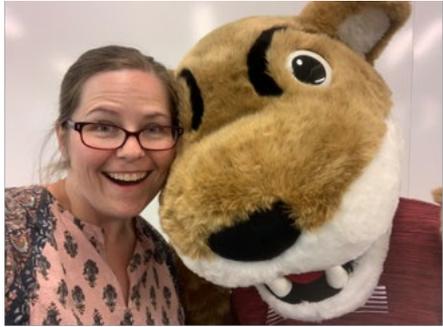

Central Office

- Signing official(s)
- 50,000 foot level
- Watch money
- Policy makers
- Official recipient of grant
- Worried about auditors



Department/College/School

- PI
- In the weeds
- Spend money
- Policy followers (we hope)
- *Think* they're the official recipient of grant
- Doers of science



Relationships with PIs (The kind HR approves)

- Trust
- Know their interests
 - Read their papers
 - Read their grants
 - Attend their seminars
 - Go to their lab
- Give them what they *think* they want
- Accounting and management are not taught in med school, natural sciences, chemistry, physics, etc.



Research is Personal

- Remember, PIs are human and research is extremely personal.
- Some PIs have experienced several rounds of rejection.
- Some PIs are balancing research, scholarship, service, teaching, clinical time.....they can have a lot of demands on their time.

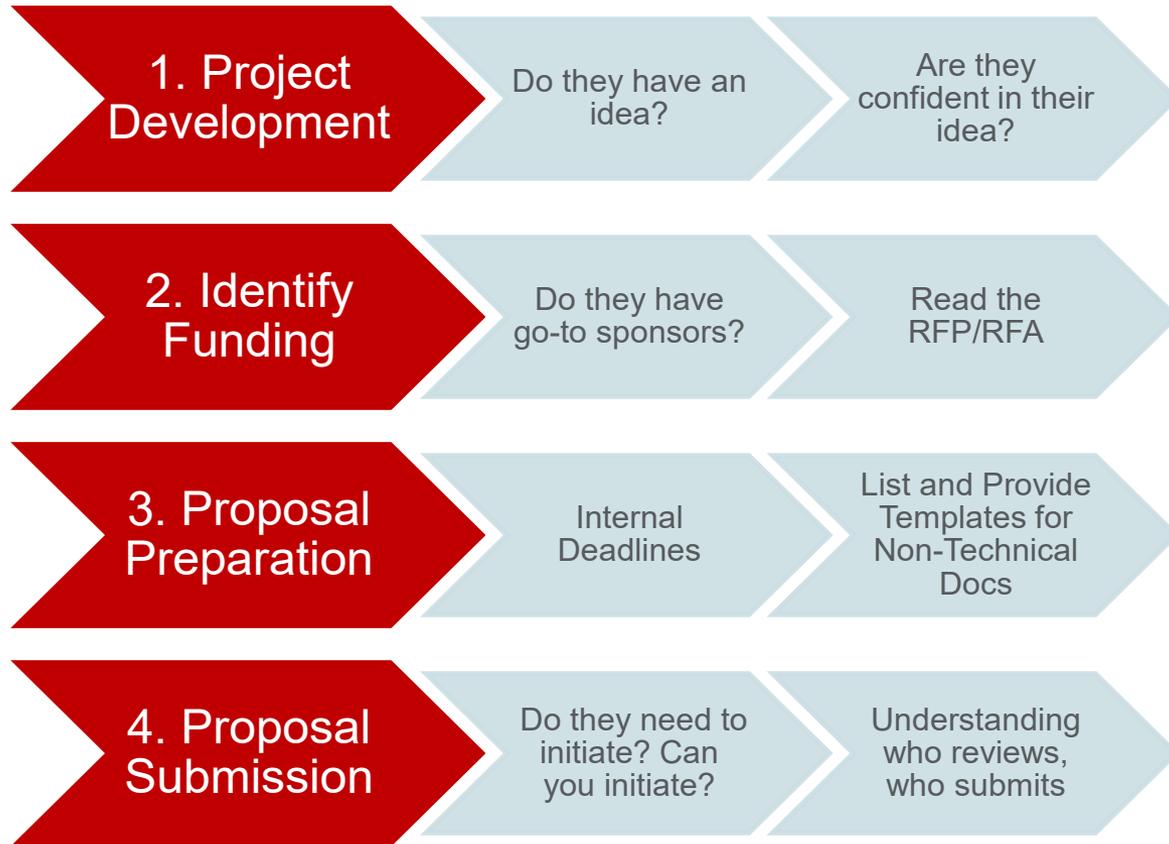


Starting the Grant Application Process

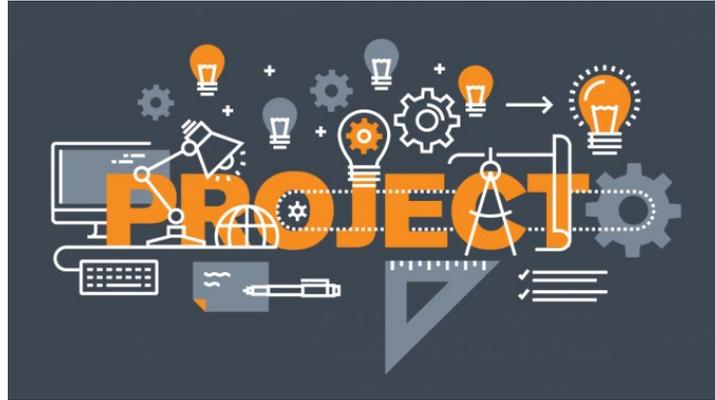
- Faculty do not always know (or remember) the details of the pre-award process.
- *Educating* them on the process can be helpful.
- Position yourself as a champion for their success.
- Empathize, but do not sympathize.



The Pre-Award Process



Project Development



- Know your limitations
- Be a cheerleader
- Call-in supervisors or colleagues to assist



Identify Funding

- Has the PI been successful?
 - Should they consider new or different sponsors?
 - Should they consider different study sections?
- Is the PI early career?
- Does the PI have regular collaborators?

Proposal Preparation: Reduce the Burden

- Communication is key!
 - Work closely with your faculty to ensure everyone is on the same page regarding the grant application (due dates, forms required, responsibilities, etc.)
- Read the RFA/RFP
 - The RFA/grant guidelines will provide guidance as to what is allowable/not allowable on a particular grant application
- Timeline – create deadlines with wiggle room



Proposal Preparation: Reduce the Burden

- The Budget
 - Walk through allowability, F&A, exclusions
 - Ask for details – are Participant Support Costs *really* Participant Support Costs?
- Provide templates for Budget Justifications, Facilities and Equipment, Letters of Support, Letters of Commitment, etc.



Proposal Preparation: Reduce the Burden

- Combined Application
 - Once the required forms are completed, a combined application will be created.
 - Review, review, review!
 - Even though the combined application is created....this does not mean everything is perfect.
 - Tips to watch for when reviewing:
 - Greek symbols that turn into squares in your PDF document
 - Application combined in proper order
 - Tables and Graphs are readable (not fuzzy, words are legible)
- Internal Approval Process
 - Various levels of internal approvals need to occur before a combined grant application can be submitted to the sponsor.



Pre-Award Submission, continued

- When a combined application is received by the central office, they start their review process.

Time = Quality of Review

- What this looks like will vary from institution to institution



Post-Award Management

You got the award – Huzzah!



.....and by you, we mean the institution.

Sometimes the PI needs to be reminded of this.



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Post-Award Management

- *The principal investigator (PI) serves as the primary individual responsible for the scientific integrity and fiscal and administrative management throughout the period of the award.*
 - *Not the signing official*
 - *Not the Dean*
 - *Not the Chair*
 - *Not the president*
 - *Etc.*



Post Award Management (cont)

Department is responsible for:

- Ensuring PI is aware of:
 - Restrictions
 - Limits
 - Spending rates
- Reviewing spending
- Ensuring project complies not only with sponsor policies, but also institution policies.
- Monitor effort
- Award closeout



What if the budget is cut?

(You really make friends by offering solutions here)



With this much grant money, the only experiment we can do is “Flip a Coin”!



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Who is Responsible?

- At the institution
 - Authorized Organizational Official
 - Principal Investigator
 - Departmental Administrator

Tell them you're keeping them out of federal prison

Compliance is.....

- The effective management of public funds to maximize research outcomes
- The avoidance of fraud, institutional mismanagement and poor management of Federal Funds
- An institutional commitment



What NOT to do and some fixes

- Allow un-allowability
- Turn a blind eye to compliance concerns
- Ignore PI questions
- Expect the PI to know what they are doing and/or remember what they need to do
