



Fig. 1 Value of U.S. Crop and Livestock Sales, 1974 - 2012





The number of U.S. farms declined slightly in the past five years, while the value of agricultural products has grown.








Direct to Consumer Sales⁵







Signed into law - February 7, 2014





Projected outlays under the 2014 Farm Act, 2014-2018





Protect and Strengthen key programs in our nation's nutrition safety net¹⁴

- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
 - Reduction in funds for 16 states and D.C.
 - Increase access to healthy foods – SNAP retailers
 - Improved SNAP access for homebound seniors

Protect and Strengthen key programs in our nation's nutrition safety net (continued)¹⁴

- The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP)
 - Funding increase →\$205 million
- The Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP)
 - Transition to only serving low-income seniors





Future of Food Initiative

- Maintain funding and protect the integrity of the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program¹⁵
 - \$5 million provided to carry out a pilot program





 - Restored/Protect funding







- Ensure funding for a variety of community-based and regional agriculture initiatives






Future of Food Initiative

 - \$100 Million investment




