Are you reacting to all the changes being sent your way ... new payment models ... new food safety guidance ... new rules & regulations ... new assessment tools for diagnosing malnutrition? Brenda Richardson, MA, RDN, LD, CD, FAND follows and will build on Maureen’s presentation, providing us an update on the changing payment and regulatory landscape and how we can establish strategies that will put us ahead of the game.

Glenda Lewis, MSPH, is Director of the Retail Food Protection Staff with the FDA/CFSAN/Office of Food Safety, and will provide us strategies that work to not only avoid food safety citations but also insight into what the new Food Code may hold.

You’ll have a chance to talk about the new strategies in small groups specific to your practice area briefly at the end of the program ... and participate in a great networking opportunity. This is your time to set up an action plan outline, applying what you have learned, and to prepare for the future.
