

Institutional Membership and Fees - 2026

Membership dues for higher education institutions are based on enrollment rates as determined by data from IPEDS for US institutions and PSIS for Canadian institutions. Memberships expire on December 31 of each year and will be prorated if an institution joins after January 1 and has not been a member within the previous 3 years. Dues are non-refundable.

System	System membership is defined as one of the following: • A singular governing body operating 2 or more educational institutions in multiple locations (university system offices, multiple campus institutions) • An organizational structure providing risk management/insurance services to multiple institutions (consortium, state/government agency, educational districts) Dues are determined by the number of individual members under the system's membership with a minimum of 6 individual members and as many additional members beyond 6 as desired with payment of additional member fees. May be grouped by 6, 10, or 20 members for ease in billing.	6 / 10 / 20	\$1,200 / \$2,000 / \$4,000	\$200

Voting Member: Institutional members designate one "Voting Member" to serve as a primary contact for the URMIA membership. When requested, the voting member will cast a vote on behalf of the entire organization. Additional administrative duties include serving as the billing contact (or delegating this to someone else), assigning/approving individuals as "Members" under the organization's membership umbrella, and keeping the organization's profile and membership roster current with the URMIA office.

Additional Individuals with Member Benefits: Institutional memberships include a set number of individual members based on the URMIA Membership Type (see chart above). Other than the designated Voting Member, members have no voting privileges. Voting Members may include additional members under the organization's membership for an extra fee per person per year.
