

URMIA Membership Categories and Fees for 2019

Voting Member

Organizational memberships include one "Voting Member" with voting responsibility and full member benefits. This person is also known as the "Primary Contact" for billing and organization-level administration.

Additional Individuals with Member Benefits

Organizational memberships include a set number of "Non-Voting Members" based on the size of the organization. These individuals receive member benefits **excluding voting rights**. Organizations may add additional Non-Voting Members (previously known as "Deputies") for an extra fee per person per year.

The Board of Directors approved this dues structure effective 2018, followed by a 2% increase annually to the base fee for Organizational Memberships through 2021.

No Voting Privileges

Memberships Available to Individuals

Type	Eligibility	Annual Dues
Retiree	An individual retired from full-time employment in higher education and the risk management profession who was an active member at the time of retirement and/or is an Emeritus Award recipient	\$0
Student	An individual who is considered a "full-time student" by the college or university attended; verification of enrollment status is required	\$0
Individual Educator	An educator or risk management practitioner who is not specifically involved in administrative responsibilities in an institution otherwise eligible for membership	\$100
International	An employee of an institution of higher education located outside of North America (does not apply to international campuses of North American-based institutions)	\$200

Dues for those joining after January 1 will be prorated based on the number of days remaining in the year.
