WGCA ANNOUNCES 2020 MARK LAESCH AWARD RECIPIENTS

CORAL SPRINGS, Florida (July 17, 2020) – The Women's Golf Coaches Association (WGCA) has announced the recipients for the 2020 Mark Laesch Awards.
