FRIDA KINHULT CAPTURES GOLFSTAT CUP

FAYETTEVILLE, Arkansas (May 22, 2019) – Florida State University freshman Frida Kinhult has been recognized as the 2018-19 Golfstat Cup recipient. The award, presented by Golfstat, is given to the player who has the best scoring average versus par with at least 20 full rounds played during a season.



Kinhult, a Fiskebäckskil, Sweden native, led Division I with a 70.66 stroke average. She netted 20 rounds of even or under par and 12 in the 60s, tallying nine top-10 finishes in her 2018-19 campaign. The freshman had two tournament victories, winning the Jim West Challenge and Darius Rucker Intercollegiate, and finished in a tie for 10th place at the NCAA Championship with a score of 223 (+4).
