DAN RODGERS NAMED 2019-20 DIVISION III GOLF PRIDE GRIPS WGCA NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

CORAL SPRINGS, Florida (May 1, 2020) – The Women's Golf Coaches Association has announced that Dan Rodgers, head coach of the Carnegie Mellon University Tartans, has been named the 2019-20 Golf Pride Grips WGCA National Coach of the Year for Division III women's collegiate golf.

Rodgers recently completed his sixth season at Carnegie Mellon University in 2019-20, with the Tartans finishing the shortened season ranked No. 1 on Golfstat. The team won three of its four tournaments, including the Golfweek Fall Invitational where they broke both the 54-hole school scoring record (908) and the 18-hole team scoring record (296). The Tartans captured two individual wins during the season and boasted three WGCA All-Americans.

In addition, the WGCA has announced the 2019-20 Golf Pride Grips WGCA Regional Coaches of the Year. The 2019-20 Golf Pride Grips WGCA Regional Coaches of the Year are as follows:
