LANCE BARROW ANNOUNCED AS SPEAKER AT WGCA AND GCAA MEMBER CONVENTIONS

CORAL SPRINGS, Fla. – CBS Sports Coordinating Producer and 13-time Emmy winner Lance Barrow will speak at the Women's Golf Coaches Association (WGCA) and Golf Coaches Association of America (GCAA) National Conventions on Monday, December 6 in Las Vegas.

Barrow has produced all of CBS's golf coverage since 1997, including for the Masters and PGA Championship. He also served as Coordinating Producer of *The NFL on CBS* and lead game producer from 2004-17 with the No. 1 NFL announce team of Jim Nantz and Phil Simms. In addition to Sunday's NFL coverage, Barrow also produced the Network's NFL Thursday Night Football games from 2014-16.



Barrow has served as producer for six Super Bowls, including as coordinating producer and lead game producer for Super Bowl 50, which was the most-watched single broadcast in television history on an all-or-part basis. He also has served as producer for coverage of two Olympic winter Games, the NCAA Men's Final Four, Daytona 500, U.S. Open Tennis Championships, and *The NFL Today*.
