Atlanta

Connecticut

Chicago

CHAPTER REPORTS

Los Angeles

With over 61 member attorneys and 12 member consultants, the LA Chapter is thriving. The members are enthusiastic about our events. We are working on developing the future leaders of the organization while ensuring that the founding members continue to be engaged and involved. Our members make a concerted effort to refer matters to fellow chapter members and WWCDAs members, before seeking outside referrals.

Michigan

In 2018, the Detroit Chapter was expanded to include the entire state of Michigan; Karen Popp was the guest speaker at the initial meeting.
