For 160 years and as one of the oldest and largest women's organizations in the nation, YWCA has been at the forefront of our most pressing social movements — from voting rights to civil rights, from affordable housing to pay equity, and from gender-based violence prevention to health care reform.

Today, YWCA combines programming and advocacy to generate institutional change in three key areas: racial justice and civil rights, empowerment and economic advancement of women and girls, and health and safety of women and girls.

YWCA programs annually serve more than 2.2 million women, girls, and families in more than 1,000 locations across the U.S. Worldwide, YWCAs serve more than 25 million women and girls in 120 countries.

OUR MISSION IMPACT

<u>2,200,000+</u> women and families are enrolled in one or more than 475 life-changing programs provided by YWCAs. More than 4,000 services are connected with these 475 programs.

<u>155,000+</u> racial justice advocates are changing communities, addressing structural racism and working toward equity and equality for all.

<u>260,000+</u> women are paving their way out of poverty and building long-term security with the help of YWCA empowerment, economic advancement, and professional development programs. These programs include leadership development, skill development, financial literacy, and employment training.

<u>170,000+</u> children and parents are learning and growing in YWCA childcare, teen and parenting programs that build stable and healthy families.

<u>145,000+</u> women and children are finding security in YWCA housing, food assistance and immigrant assistance programs.

<u>300,000+</u> women, girls and families are getting and staying healthy through YWCA wellness, recovery, counseling, exercise, athletics and aquatics programs.

500,000+ women, girls and families are getting and staying safe through sexual assault, trafficking, domestic violence and gender violence prevention programs.





YWCA major programs and number of YWCAs providing services in each area




Proportion of YWCAs serving each community size





Number of YWCAs with each type of program facility



Number of people served in each major area


YWCAs are serving

Since many benefit from more than one service, the total served by YWCA programs is more than 2.2 million.






Race/Ethnic identities of YWCA service populations




Gender identities of YWCA service populations

Economic status of YWCA service populations 62% live at or below the federal poverty line as reported by YWCAs as a whole; 72% when totaled for each program









How We Are Funded
