For those wanting to use this form to record data before entering it on the online form (to be launched in mid-February), opening it in a current version of MS Word will allow editing. However, text and line spacing as well as page breaks may change from the original depending on your MS Word settings. Using "Select All," then changing the spacing to single and the font size to 10.5 may help.

The report has four sections. All YWCAs need to complete Section 1 and 2, then 4 if need be.

Once the information requested in Sections 1 and 2 is provided, YWCAs move to each part of Section 3 to provide information pertaining to the major programs marked in Section 2.
