



YWCA'S #YWOMENVOTE CAMPAIGN: YOUR VOICE. YOUR VOTE. YOUR FUTURE.

Background

YWCA's recently-launched **#YWomenVote** "get out the vote" (GOTV) campaign encourages and uplifts women's voices and the importance of civic engagement. Together, we're taking steps to reach our goal of registering and mobilizing 10,000 women to vote on Election Day 2018! Across social media and onsite at GOTV events, YWCA is sharing stories of **#YWomenVote**, because women know profoundly the importance of showing up to the polls. It's time our voices are heard.

We are asking for your support in **coordinating your social media messages** with those being produced by YWCA USA's Washington, DC office. We need your team to retweet and repost our **key themed messages every Monday and Friday through election day on November 6, 2018.** Our goal is to get the entire YWCA network on-message as we lift up key issues that tell the world #YWomenVote.

Week 1 of the #YWomenVote campaign celebrated National Voter Registration Day with the premiere of YWCA's BRAND NEW video that highlights #YWomenVote and encourages people to register to vote. Week 2 promoted What Women Want 2018, YWCA's new report on the top concerns and priorities of women. Week 3 focused in on two key themes from this report: women's broad concerns about gender-based violence and about access to affordable health care. Week 4 continued our focus on gender-based violence as part of YWCA's Week Without Violence activities. Week 5 focused on the top economic and caregiving priorities for women.

Week 6 Spotlight: Women's Health and Social Justice Priorities

During the week of October 29-November 2, please join us in lifting up the top health care and social justice priorities for women. According to YWCA's *What Women Want 2018* report, one of women's top concerns is health care, with more than 60% of women worried about medical expenses or securing affordable health insurance coverage. More than 40% are also worried about having access to the full range of reproductive health care, having access to mental health services, and keeping their families safe from opioid and other substance addiction.

This is why 8 out of 10 women want Congress to **protect the Affordable Care Act**, particularly provisions providing coverage for pre-existing conditions, preventative health services for women, and access to birth control services, and to pass **the Trauma-Informed Care for Children and Families Act** and the **Preventing Maternal Deaths Act**. Moreover, women agree that **protecting Roe V. Wade** (77%), passing legislation to end racial profiling (68%), and immigration solutions like the Dream Act (74%), comprehensive immigration reform (78%), and ending family separation (74%) and family detention (69%) should be priorities for Congress.
